



# From the Pastor's Pen

**TAKING A STAND.** In today's 1<sup>st</sup> Reading, Joshua shows real leadership. He places on the shoulders of the people a very weighty decision while clearly taking his own stand. "Decide today whom you will serve."

In the Gospel, several of the first hearers of Jesus' teaching make a decision to turn away: "As a result of this, many of his disciples returned to their former way of life and no longer accompanied him" (John 6:66).

How many Christians have not yet to really choose Christ? His way and his teaching echo about the walls of earthly living, but our vital foundations? Born, baptized, confirmed and ushered into the Communion line, many a Catholic remains on the fence.

This month has been a time for us to reflect on the Eucharist and its place in our lives.

It was painful for Jesus to hear the words, "This saying is hard, who can accept it?" The 'saying' is both his strong language about eating his flesh and drinking his blood as well as the out-of-this-world claim that he is Heaven-sent by the Father.

He turns to the 12, "Will you leave too?" Peter responds, "Where?" Then he adds why he and the others are going to hang in there, "You have the words of Eternal Life."

What is our reason for choosing Christ?

For what reason might you dare to echo Joshua's bold claim, "For me and my house-

### **Teachings on the Mass**

EUCHARISTIC LITURGY. Catechesis by Pope Francis on the Holy Mass. The Eucharistic Prayer corresponds to what Jesus himself did, at the table with the Apostles at the



Last Supper, when "he gave thanks" over the bread and then over the cup of wine. His thanksgiving lives again each time we celebrate the Eucharist, joining us to his sacrifice of salvation.

After inviting the people to lift up their hearts to the Lord and to give him thanks, the priest pronounces the Eucharistic Prayer aloud, in the name of all those present, addressing the Father through Jesus in the Holy Spirit.

First there is the Preface, which is the act of thanksgiving for the gifts of God, in particular for sending his Son as Savior. The Preface concludes with the "Holy, Holy, Holy". The whole assembly joins its voice to that of the Angels and Saints to praise and glorify God.

There is then the invocation of the Spirit, that he come and that Jesus may be in the bread and wine. The action of the Holy Spirit and the efficacy of the very words of Christ uttered by the priest make truly present, under the form of bread and wine, his Body and his

Blood, his sacrifice offered on the Cross once and for all. Jesus was most clear about this.

It is the Body of Jesus; it ends there! Faith: faith comes to our aid; by an act of faith we believe that it is the Body and Blood of Jesus. It is the "mystery of faith", as we say after the consecration. The priest says: "Mystery of

faith", and we respond with an acclamation. Commemorating the Lord's death and Resurrection, in expectation of his glorious return, the Church offers the Father the sacrifice which reconciles heaven and earth: she offers the paschal sacrifice of Christ, offering herself with him and asking, by the power of the Holy Spirit, to become "one body, one spirit in Christ" (Eucharistic Prayer III). This is the grace and the fruit of sacramental Communion: we are nourished of the Body of Christ to become, we who eat of it, his Body living today in the world.

No one and nothing is forgotten in the Eucharistic Prayer, but every thing is attributed to God, as is recalled by the doxology which concludes it. No one is forgotten. And if I have someone, relatives, friends, who are in need or have departed from this world to the other, I can name them at that time, interiorly and silently, or write the name so it may be said aloud.

This codified formulation of prayer, perhaps we may feel it to be somewhat distant — it is true, it is an ancient formula — but, if we truly understand the significance, then we will certainly participate better. Indeed it expresses all that we fulfil in the Eucharistic celebration; moreover, it teaches us to cultivate three attitudes that should never be lacking in Jesus' disciples. The three attitudes: first, learn "to give thanks, always and everywhere", and not only on certain occasions, when all is going well; second, to make of our life a gift of love, freely given; third, to build concrete communion, in the Church and with everyone. Thus, this central Prayer of the Mass teaches us, little by little, to make of our whole life a "Eucharist", that is, an act of thanksgiving.
