

From the Pastor's Pen &



TAKING A STAND BEFORE TAKING SIDES. People can be quick to divvy up the political, national, and cultural landscape into good guys and bad guys—with the intent of forcing people to take sides. Or sometimes we're just so tied to our social circle that, without even knowing it, we set up barriers rather than bridges between 'us' & 'them'.

Jesus' followers seem to take it for granted that to harness Jesus' power you have to be a member of his group. He counters this attitude by saying: whoever isn't against us is for us.

It shocked many Catholics when Vatican II recognized the presence of the Holy Spirit in the development of the Ecumenical Movenent (dialog with other Christians), and the hand of God at work in other religions (Inter-Religious Dialog).

Christian open-mindedness is not mere fence-sitting. Cooperating with people with whom you don't totally agree is hard work.

In fact, Christian acceptance of others is grounded in taking a firm stand, which has nothing to do with being wishy-washy.

In the second half of the Gospel, tolerant-Jesus speaks about the fires of Gehenna and sinking to the bottom of the sea with a millstone collar. What's with that?

Jesus' stand against sin is absolute. Sin's gravity appears in its eternal conseguences, "their worm does not die and the fire is not guenched." Jesus feels no conflict between a broad acceptance of others and a very firm stand against sin. I guess that's what Mercy does.



The more firmly we stand with Jesus Christ, the broader our outlook. Doesn't it seem like the more Godly one becomes, so too the more patient that person toward others? Jesus shows us that the most inclusive person is the one who takes the firmest stand (obviously not on trifles, but on essentials). Pretty amazing.

Some examples about what others are doing out there. There are so many people doing great things. The next few weeks will be packed with living examples.

This Sunday, we review and appreciate and consider supporting the outreach work done right here in ND through the many-pronged ministry of ND Catholic Charities.

This Sunday, Todd Mikkelson speaks to us about the Friends of Chimbote and invites to learn more through a special meeting on Oct 13.

Next weekend, Fr Robert Karris OFM will be taking the Masses to speak about the worldwide efforts of the organization, Food For The Poor.

At the end of October, Mr. Glen Gauer (and Family, we hope) will come to give each of our parishes a 3-Day Conference, events which are open to anyone and everyone.

It should never cease to amaze us how active the Holy Spirit is and how diverse the Spirit's work is in so many people. No wonder Jesus calls his followers to be open-minded folks.
