From the Pastor's secretary's Pen

In Loving Memory of



DARLENE JOHNSON

Last Friday, I was in Gardar, North Dakota, for the funeral of my aunt (my mother's only sister) who passed away from complications of Parkinson's. She was a wonderful, beautiful lady who did not let this horrible disease take away her incredible sense of humor or her faith in God. She had given her four daughters a list of Bible verses and hymns that she lived by and that got her through the last 25 years with this disease. These daughters asked several people—me included—to read some of these at her funeral. My aunt, Darlene Johnson, even specified which version of the Bible (King James version) she wanted the verses read from. My mom had done the same thing but forgot to tell us where she put this list. We didn't find it until well after her funeral. Great minds think alike, I guess. Anyway, here are some of these wonderful passages:

- Philippians 4:13** - I can do all things through Christ which strengthens me.
- 1 Thessalonians 5: 16-18** - Rejoice evermore. Pray without ceasing. In every thing give thanks: for this is the will of God in Christ Jesus concerning you.
- Hebrew 11:1** - Now faith is the substance of things hoped for, the evidence of things not seen.
- Romans 8: 37-39** - Nay, in all things we are more than conquerors through him that loved us. For I am persuaded, that neither death, nor life, nor angels, nor principalities, nor powers, nor things present, nor things to come, nor height, nor depth, nor any other creature, shall be able to separate us from the love of God, which is in Christ Jesus our Lord.
- John 3:16** - For God so loved the world, that he gave his only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in him should not perish, but have everlasting life.

- Philippians 4:6-7** - Be careful for nothing; but in every thing by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known unto God. And the peace of God, which passes all understanding, shall keep your hearts and minds through Christ Jesus.
- 1 Peter 4:8** - And above all things have fervent charity among yourselves: for charity shall cover the multitude of sins
- Deuteronomy 6:5** - And thou shalt love the LORD thy God with all thine heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy might.
- Ephesians 2: 8-10** - For by grace are ye saved through faith: and that not of yourselves: *it is* the gift of God: Not of works, lest any man should boast. For we are his workmanship, created in Christ Jesus unto good works, which God hath before ordained that we should walk in them.
- Romans 15:13** - Now the God of hope fill you with all joy and peace in believing, that ye may abound in hope, through the power of the Holy Spirit.
- Matthew 22:37-40** - Jesus said unto him, Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind. This is the first and greatest commandment. And the second is like it, Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself. On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets.
- 1 Peter 3:8** - Finally, *be ye* all of one mind, having compassion one of another, love as brethren, *be* pitiful, *be* courteous:

Now, I have to go find all these passages in my Bible. These truly are words to live by. I figure, if this gentle, loving woman can endure 25 years with Parkinson's Disease with such incredible grace and dignity, OK, and humor, I can handle my measly problems with a similar grace and certainly a VERY similar humor, and one of my favorite quotes.

*Pray without ceasing,
if necessary use words!*

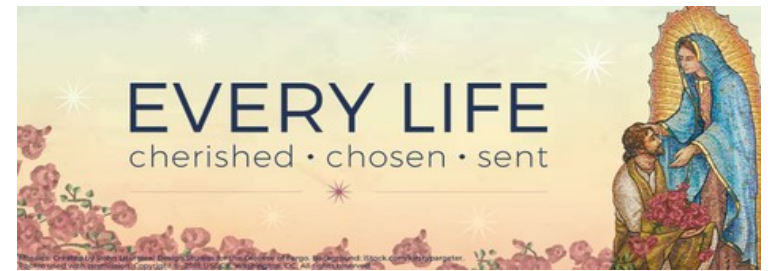
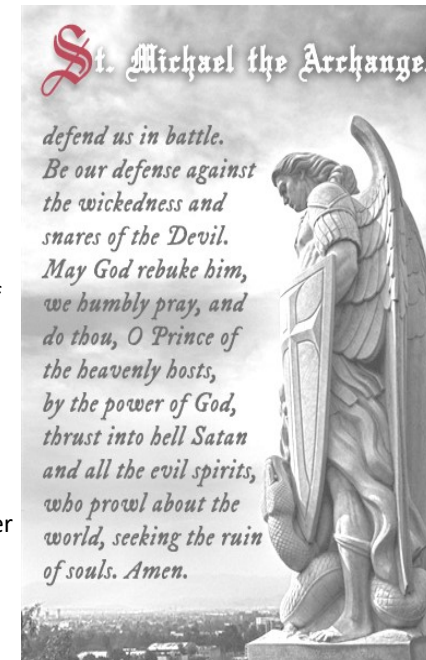
The business cards have the place and times of the Conferences.
