



HE RECEIVED HIS SIGHT AND FOLLOWED HIM ON THE WAY—so ends today's Gospel. Every day we need salvation. Every day, we should take this step from beggar to disciple. Bartimaeus, the blind man begs for his sight, is healed, then sets out behind the Lord, becoming part of his community.




Glen promises to mix music and humor to a vital message about the Holy Spirit. Glen is Catholic, but has a message for everyone. Please invite any— and every-one.

They would also like to thank the parishioners of St. Andrew's and St. Mark's for allowing Fr. Michael to take the time to do this service for them. They are very grateful.




