




Stewardship Moment: "Therefore, stay awake, for you know neither the day nor the hour." - MATTHEW 25:13

# From the Pastor's Pen

GIVING OUR ALL. Our Lord is in his final days. Jesus warms the crowd not to follow the example of those who seek honor and attention from others. After observing how pilgrims are contributing to the Temple treasury, Jesus notices a poor widow's offering and commends her great sacrifice. In contrast to the rich, who gave large sums, Jesus commends the widow's offering because hers was more than the others, since she put in everything she had.



To give not just from our surplus but from our need, our very livelihood, shows great trust that God will provide for us. This is precisely what Jesus does on the Cross.

We may scratch our heads and wonder how we could ever give that much, all we have. It's something to work for. Indeed, we are all working toward this. If we don't *get 'r done* in this life, then we hope it'll happen in the next. This is what Purgatory is about.

SOMETHING ON PURGATORY from Peter Kreeft, Everything You Ever Wanted to Know About Heaven, but Never Dreamed of Asking.

"Purgatory is reading the already-written book of your life with total understanding and acceptance—the total understanding that comes only *from* total acceptance" pg. 65. After life has ended, Purgatory allows us to step back and re-read our stories from God's perspective. It's a time to confront our histories without any rationalization or self-deception. Purgatory frees us to understand our choices and their consequences for ourselves and others.

"Human kind," T. S. Elliot wrote, "cannot bear very much reality." Can we really bear to accept the responsibility for the injuries we have inflicted on others? Offenses, paybacks, lies,

greed, lust, sarcasm, indifference and violence ripple through our communities. We waste time protecting ourselves against this knowledge; but in Purgatory God reveals to us the truth of our lives. Denial is no longer a possibility. God brings us into reality, into knowledge, into responsibility. This is the suffering of Purgatory.


Only a few can endure the saint's insight that "we are each responsible for all." In Purgatory I will experience all the harm I have done, with a sensitized and mature conscience; I will experience it also with the compassion and forgiveness of God, forgiving myself as God forgives me. I will see Jesus in an all new light.

The Saints assist us in the apprehension of our sins. The support of the saints, both those in heaven as those on earth, are crucial as we read the book of our lives. Through prayer and examination we attempt to read them now; after death the light will be much better for reading.

The communion of saints, suggests Kreeft, is essential to the process of transformation, "for there is no more effective method of religious education than the presence of saints" pg. 72. Even in Purgatory, especially in Purgatory, we need teachers and communicators of holiness. For those who choose Heaven today, and strive to walk with the Saints, Purgatory has already begun.

A PRAYER AS DEATH COMES KNOCKING: "When the signs of age begin to mark my body (and still more when they touch my mind); when the illness that is to diminish me or carry me off strikes from without or is born within me; when the painful moment comes in which I suddenly awaken to the fact I am losing

hold of myself and am absolutely passive within the great unknown forces that have formed me; in all those dark moments, O God, grant that I may understand that it is You (provided only my faith is strong enough) who are painfully parting the fibers of my being in order to penetrate to the very marrow of my substance and bear me away within Yourself....
