From the Pastor's Pen



IMAGINING A KING. When did Jesus reveal himself as king? On the wood of the Cross! There it was written as Pilate dictated. We summarize it as INRI – Iesus Nazarenus Rex Iudeorum, or, Jesus of Nazareth King of the Jews.


Today's Gospel almost suggests that Jesus denies the title 'King'. His kingship was a mockery. They crowned him with thorns. They cloaked him with 'royal' purple, then blindfolded him and spat in his face. They beat him with the staff that was to represent his authority.

"You say that I'm a king. But my kingdom is not of this world."

Despite such coarse treatment, after his Resurrection, he would still dare claim, "All power in heaven and on earth has been given to me" (Mt 28:18).

What an extraordinary person!

Through the ages, faithful followers would refer to Jesus as King. But the Feast of Christ the King was not instituted until 1925 by Pope Pius XI. The Pope saw it as a way to proclaim Christ's prerogatives over all other forces in society, be they families, governments or nations. It was a counter-blow to the rising power of secularism, a way of organizing life without reference to God.



submission? If that's **NOT** the lesson from the Gospels, how should we proclaim Christ as King during a period of decline in Christiani Pope St Paul VI (just canonized a month ago) made an interesting move. Think bigger! In 1969, he elevated the feast

to a Solemnity and changed its name to "Our Lord Jesus Christ King of the Universe". In the Latin, the title UNIVERSORUM REGIS can translate as 'King of all things' or 'of all unities' (it's in the plural), or simply 'of the Universe', understood simply as all that exists.

This Solemnity points to the end of time when Jesus' Kingdom will come in all its fullness. It's a glorious bookend to the Liturgical Year. The next Sunday we start afresh with the First Sunday of Advent, when we begin to commemorate the first coming in humility of the newborn King.


It is intriguing to consider what all is implied by the term 'King of the Universe.'



In an age when we take for granted realities like our Solar System, the Milky Way galaxy and the Big Bang theory opening a vision of the Universe beyond reckoning, is it worth asking, "Is Jesus King of all that?"

By distancing his Kingdom from worldly political powers, Jesus opens our minds to a reign that can only be worthy of God, rooted in the heart of humble believers and extending to the farthest imaginable corners of the Universe.

It's hard to say which is more awe-inspiring: the dimensions of such a reign or that it was inaugurated on a hideous Cross. But more impressive than either of those facts is the very person of the one who says, "I came into the world to testify to the truth and whoever belongs to the truth listens to my voice." Spoken like a **true King**.
