

From the Pastor's Pen



FATHER'S WILL. In the Creed each Sunday we profess, "For us men and for our salvation, he came down from Heaven." What a journey! Do we ever think about what Christmas meant for Christ?

The Christmas Angel declares, "I bring you good news of great joy. Today is born for you a Savior, who is Christ the Lord" (Lk 2:11). Great news for us, but what did it cost that Baby?

Eternal Son of God, Light from Light, True God from True God, he traveled in obedience to the Father into a world dark with strife, a dwelling place of those who do not know the Father, who struggle to accept the possibility of a God of Pure Love.

Behind the Babe, like a boat's disappearing wake, lies his Father's omnipotence and freedom; before him awaits the powerlessness of an infant, the restrictions of a physical universe, and obedience to mere mortals. Behind him, he leaves the comfort of Divine Glory; before him looms the prospect of shouldering the sin of the world, death, the tomb.

But just because the Son left a lot behind, doesn't mean he came empty handed.

Let's consider on the other hand what Jesus brought with him "from Heaven." In the Letter to the Hebrews, we heard, "Behold, I come to do your will." Jesus brings to mere Earthlings the amazing power to do the will of the Eternal Father "on earth as it is in heaven."

Christ also brings joy. He rejoices that the Father has hidden these things from worldly, self-satisfied folk who want to call their own shots. Jesus rejoices to reveal a hidden passageway to the childlike, those who, like John the Baptist, leap in the womb of Mother Church for joy that a Door has opened allowing Light from On High to visit our present darkness.

God has set out on this journey toward us.

Who will step out in faith to welcome the coming Christ Child?

HOME COMING. In our 1st Reading, Micah, in a prophecy about a new king born in David's little hometown of Bethlehem, foresees that "the rest of his kindred will return."

Jesus is a rallying force. We must fight the temptation to see Christmas in purely social terms as a time to exchange gifts and visit relatives. This 'family time' is a divine gift. It is the Holy Spirit kneading us in the name of Jesus. As the Spirit pushed Mary over the hill country to visit Elizabeth, so the Spirit urges families to gather around the ever-unfolding mystery of Emmanuel, God-with-us.

Christmas is a choice time to invite friends and family to join you in worship. Some of that is automatic; it's expected. Sometimes, such a simple invite is a big challenge.


