

January 12-13, Baptism of the Lord

From the Pastor's Pen



THE BAPTISM OF JESUS is a continuation of the Epiphany, the feast of *manifestation*. Jesus' baptism is his 'coming out' from the hidden life, his *manifestation* as a public figure. This event is also a 'coming out' of the Trinity: the Son identifies with sinners, the Father's Voice declares him "Beloved", the Spirit hovers above as over a 2nd creation.

St. Luke's account focuses less on the event and more on the aftermath—the descent of the Holy Spirit while Jesus was at prayer. In St Matthew's account, the Voice is heard by the people, whereas in Luke, the Voice seems as though it's an intimate moment between Father & Son.

By celebrating Jesus' Baptism, the Church invites us to recognize the role of the Spirit and the importance of prayer in our own lives. Through Baptism, each Christian becomes God's beloved child. Awareness of this reality is the driving Force in our lives.

The God who adopted each of us in Baptism is not some distant disembodied voice. At our Baptism, our parents and godparents on our behalf professed the Faith in the form of the Apostles' Creed. Becoming a member of Jesus' Body, we began to share in his mission of serving and saving people. Insofar as we embrace this union with Jesus, we too can hear the Father's Voice saying, 'You are my beloved'.

It was at prayer that Jesus became aware of the Spirit's power. Today we too are invited to pray, really pray. The Baptism shows us that Prayer is simply opening our lives to the Spirit's lead. The Spirit harnesses our lives for the work of Salvation, drawing the world closer to God in Jesus, one little act of love at a time.

The Spirit brings new Energy. Jesus' Baptism signals that something new is happening. Thanks to Jesus, our shared humanity has become a channel for the Spirit to work in the world in new ways. Today is about Sacred Energy and our own prayerlife. What the Spirit accomplishes is simply this: the opening up of the Eternal in time. "Heaven was opened and the Spirit descended...."

Our earthly experience is that everything dies. Everything tends in the direction of corruption, breakdown, ultimate disintegration. What the Holy Spirit brings is *eternal worth* of who we are and all we do. The firstfruits of Eternal Life is believing in Eternity.

In our lives, we can get stuck. Our faith needs new infusions of the Spirit to give new energy to stay oriented to what never passes away. Can we be the type of people who know how good it is to be open to God's Spirit, open to new life, new love, being together on a journey that will never end?

SISTER VERONICA, OUR FRIEND. Did you happen to see the article on page 19 of our last edition of the New

Earth? There's a beautiful article written by Sr Veronica of the Immaculate Heart of Mary. In the past I've told you that a Sister from the Carmel of Mary in Wahpeton has spiritually adopted our parishes of Bottineau and Westhope.

In the article, Sister describes the departure of two Sisters, one of whom was her best friend. This was a very difficult time for the community and Sr Veronica in particular. It was shortly after this event that Mother Madonna contacted me and asked if I was interested in corresponding with Sr. Veronica. And the rest, as they say, is history.


If you didn't get a chance, or didn't make the connection, please read her story and know that we in Bottineau County are especially carried in the heart of this special soul.


