

From the Pastor's Pen



YOU WILL BE CHILDREN OF THE MOST HIGH. Jesus is called "Son of God" and his disciples "the children of God." As children of God, we can entertain wild hope for blessings in this life and eternal life with God in the next. What's the price? Just follow the Gospel.

Fellowship with God begins when a disciple lives according to the Gospel. Jesus did not drum up arbitrary commandments. To follow Jesus' teachings is to conform one's life to the Father. Doing so one cannot help but be a true child of God.

This Sunday's Gospel relates some of Jesus' toughest teachings. Are Jesus words impossible to live? Are you tempted to look upon loving enemies and blessing those who curse you as high ideals that no one was ever expected to achieve? This would be a mistake.

Jesus intended his disciples to strive to fulfill these commandments. He drew these lessons from the Father's heart, and he expected his disciples to pattern their lives after the things the Father had taught him.

"I sense that the moment has come to commit all the Church's energies to a new evangelization and to the mission ad gentes. No believer in Christ, no institution of the Church can avoid this supreme duty: to proclaim Christ to all peoples." POPE JOHN PAUL II (REDEMPTORIS MISSIO)

His first lesson was the Father's gift of eternal love. At every moment in his life, Jesus knew the Father's love, followed the Father's command to love and sought to fulfill the Father's dream of a world built on love. No one is excluded.

Another lesson comes from how the Father dealt with Israel. Although the people of Israel strayed from the covenant, again and again the Father sought them out and forgave them. God took Israel back when it seemed irrational (Is. 43:19-28; Ez. 20:40-44). Divine love always overcame judgment. The Father would remain faithful even when his people did not.

A final lesson comes from nature. The sun rises on both sinners and saints. God's rain falls on the good and the bad alike. Jesus built his life around these lessons from the Father. He expected his disciples to do the same.


Children resemble their parents. To live the Gospel makes us like the Father, and this is what it means to be a child of God.

Finding the loving thing to do in any given situation, or forgiving those who wrong us, or sharing our gifts even with those who don't deserve them—this is how God acts. And so, it's also how his children are expected to behave.

Can you count a few ways in which you already resemble God?

Where in nature have you learned the lessons of God?

When we put these lessons into practice, the work of evangelization plows ahead.


