

From the Pastor's Pen



HOLY WEEK. To get us ready for this holiest of all weeks, Molten Core of the Christian Year, we have been listening to "Explaining the Easter Triduum" bit by bit each week of Lent.

The main reason for our review is to educate ourselves on what this week is about. We learn in order to understand what we're celebrating. These events happened long ago, in a sense. The Church celebrates them as ongoing realities. The Sacraments of the Church make present the Mystery of Christ's Passover so we can enter in and be transformed.

We've made a push this year in light of celebrating **Holy Thursday** in both parishes (5:30 in Bottineau; 8:00 in Westhope). We're expecting generous participation.




There is a Sign-Up Sheet for the Washing of the Feet. This symbolic gesture of loving service accompanies Jesus' new commandment to love one another as he has loved us (Jn 13:34). Christians are servants. They serve one another and the world. Christians show the world that the Church is a place ruled by mutual love and respect. By loving the world, even enemies and unbelievers, we show our confidence in God's ultimate triumph over all the forces of corruption.

To further symbolize this love, we bring up in procession the fresh Holy Oils consecrated at the Bishop's Chrism Mass, celebrated at the Fargo Cathedral on Tues morning. The old Oils will be consumed in the Easter Vigil Fire.

Also, this evening celebrates Jesus' instituting a New Order of Priesthood with the command, "Do this in memory of Me." This holy night is

when and where the worldwide college of bishops originates. Jesus consecrates them in the truth. It is the beginning of the Apostles' mission to distribute Christ's saving Paschal Mystery to the ends of the earth. It is the first link of a new priesthood in the person of Christ giving way to an unbroken chain 'til Jesus returns again at the end of time.



WHAT IT'S ALL ABOUT, as summed up by one of our Fathers in Faith, Pope Saint Leo the Great (1461),

"Dearly beloved, let us acknowledge what Saint Paul, the teacher of the nations, acknowledged so exultantly: This is a saying worthy of trust, worthy of complete acceptance: Christ Jesus came into this world to save sinners.

"God's compassion for us is all the more wonderful because Christ died, not for the righteous or the holy but for the wicked and the sinful. Though the divine nature could not be touched by the sting of death, he took to himself, through his birth as one of us, something he could offer on our behalf.

"The power of his death confronted our death. In the words of Hosea the prophet: Death, I shall be your death. By dying he submitted to the laws of the underworld; by rising again he destroyed them. He did away with the everlasting character of death so as to make death a thing of time, not of eternity."

On Good Friday, as in years past, we will begin the Novena of Divine Mercy just before the Good Friday Service (Noon in Westhope; 5:30pm in Bottineau).

Remember, Good Friday is a day of Fast & Abstinence.

We will also take up a special collection at the Good Friday Services to help the Christians in the Holy
