




# From the Pastor's Pen



AN EASTER PRAYER. As the Evangelist St. Luke understands it, God sent His eternal Son specifically to reveal the Resurrection so human beings could live without the fear of death.


**Today, dear Jesus, EASTER SUNDAY**, we celebrate Your rising from the dead. Your victory brings a joy hard to express. We look around at budding Nature. It reminds us of You and helps us give thanks.



The seeds we plant seem dry and dead, but with the wonders of rain and sun and soil they awake. Rising from their death-like sleep, plants grow green and beautiful in our gardens and fields. The trees, too, that stood so stark and lifeless through Winter yearn to go green.

These reminders of a Resurrection help us remember that death is

not the end of things. Help us keep in mind that we shall rise again on the last day, to live with You forever. Then there will be no more



With You we will celebrate the eternal Easter, an everlasting Spring, if only we realize now that there is no glory without suffering, no Easter without a Good Friday Seed falling to the Earth and dying. Help us, by Your grace, to live good lives open already by the seed of faith to this New Life with You. Amen.



NOVENA OF DIVINE MERCY, begun on Good Friday, will continue to be recited before each of the daily Masses through next wkend.

THE IMAGE OF DIVINE MERCY dates from 1931, when Our Lord appeared to Sr. Faustina. Two rays streamed from his heart, one red and the other pale white. He said, "Paint an image according to the pattern you see with the words: Jesus, I Trust in You. I promise that the souls who venerate this image will not perish. I also promise victory over their enemies already here on earth, especially at the hour of death... I am offering people a vessel to which they can come as to the fountain of mercy... I desire that this image be venerated throughout the world."

The pale ray stands for the Waters of Baptism; the red ray stands for his life-giving Blood. "These two rays issued forth from the very depths of My tender mercy when my agonized Heart was opened by a lance on the Cross. Happy is the one who will dwell in the shelter of

Jesus himself requested that the Feast of Mercy, the Sunday after Easter, be preceded by a novena of Chaplets to the Divine Mercy. St. Faustina wrote that Jesus told her: "On each

day of the novena you will bring to My Heart a different group of souls and you will immerse them in this ocean of My mercy.... By this novena I will grant every possible grace to souls" (Diary 1209, 796).

Pamphlets are available for those participating in the Novena of Divine Mercy.




May 15: Bible Study 7:00pm
