From the Pastor's Pen



EATING TOGETHER. Today we hear of the last appearance of the risen Jesus in the Gospel of John. It is unusual. At some unspecified time after the Resurrection, there's Jesus cooking breakfast for his friends. They come ashore to eat from him who is the Bread of Life.



Jesus spent time lighting the fire so he could cook breakfast on the seashore. Does it remind you of any campouts? Who gets the fire going in the morning? Well, here's Jesus, the risen Lord. No big apparitions in the sky, but just this simple act in the dawn of cooking breakfast.

It was a meal for tired disciples. Often in the Gospel, we hear about preparing and serving meals. Jesus accomplished so much at meals.

Breakfast on the Beach

Jesus said to them, "Come and have breakfast." None of the disciples dared ask him, "Who are you?" They knew it was the Lord. John 21:12 (NIV)

Based on John 21:1-14

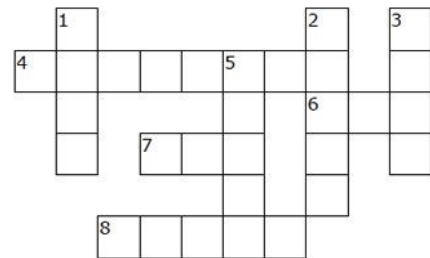


In cooking for people love is active. Someone might count up how many meals she/he has cooked and call them hours of love. It's how Jesus did some of his best work.

The second half of the story revisits the events of Jesus' Passion. Then, Peter stood by a fire and denied three times that he knew Jesus. Now again, beside a charcoal fire, Peter is given the opportunity to be fully reconciled to his Master. Thus, the breakfast meal ends with questions about love. It's a reminder that the Church must remain open to hearing Jesus' question and to observing his command: 'Do you love me? ... then feed my sheep.'

The love and friendship of Jesus passes through our loving service of others. This is what it means to be on mission with Jesus Christ.

Risen Lord Jesus, increase my gratitude for what you accomplish through mealtimes.

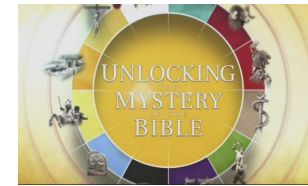
