PENTECOST

From the Pastor's Pen



ONENESS IN CHRIST is the promise that Pentecost fulfills and guarantees.

When Christ's mission on earth was done, it still remained necessary for the people of the Earth to become sharers in the divine nature.

As long as Christ was in the flesh on Earth, his followers had their go-to place for questions. During this time, the Son was united to the Father through their one Spirit. When the time came for Jesus to be reunited to the Father in Heaven, God planned that Christ remain the Head of his Body. This union with believers would happen through the same Spirit. The Holy Spirit who unites Father and Son would also unite the members of the Son's Body to his Person at the Father's Right Hand.



By the Spirit, Jesus would forever dwell in the hearts of his worshippers through faith. The Spirit enables them in every age to cry out: **Abba, Father**, just like Jesus—not just with lips, but with our lives.

The Old & New Testaments illustrate how the Spirit is a dynamic power altering the whole pattern of life of believers. Many people going in many directions are all of a sudden caught up in a single movement. Instead everybody doing their own thing, they join forces.

It works like rain. Jesus said: *the water I will give you will become in you a fountain of living water welling up to eternal life.*

Everything needs water. The same rain comes down from the heavens, yet it produces one thing in the carrot another in the rose bush, and so on throughout creation. That one thing they share thanks to the rain is what we call life—that's biology.



In the same way, the Holy Spirit, whose loving, uniting nature imbues each person with the grace needed to play their part. It's like St. Paul says, "As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ. For in one Spirit we were all baptized into one body and were all given to drink of one Spirit" (1 Co 12:12-13). This is the stuff of eternal life—that's theology.

As our Easter Season reaches its climax on this feast of Pentecost, let's pray for our parishes. Drinking in one Spirit, let's enjoy this royal privilege of all going in the same direction--Eternity.

May they live on in our midst as little helpers in the journey of faith—from one generation to the next.



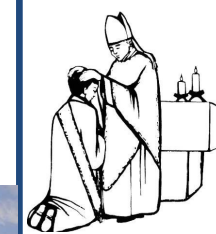
