

From the Pastor's Pen



THE FATHER OF JESUS CHRIST. Jesus said to his disciples, "I still have many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth." So opens today's Gospel.



Over the next several decades, the Spirit would lead the followers of Jesus of Nazareth to stake their faith on an understanding of God's Tri-Unity, the Trinity. Only over a series of controversies did the truth of the Trinity arise. It didn't come into its own until the 4th century.

First lesson, God is patient. Second lesson, we catch on only gradually. Third lesson, we should be as patient with ourselves and with one another and with God, as God is with us.

On this Father's Day, it's good to celebrate the Father. Jesus invites his followers to love a God who is close, good and tender. He wanted us to have a familiarity with God. To capture the closeness of 'family', it's no wonder Jesus referred to this wonderfully Source as Father. What characterizes this Father is neither power nor threat. This God is sheer, pure goodness, mercy, and inexhaustible patience.

It is precisely about this Reality that St Paul says, "the love of God has been

poured into our hearts."

This past June 2, Pope Francis was asked, "Holy Father, you insisted again on the importance of the relationship between grandparents and young people so that young people have roots to move forward and so that grandparents can dream. Holy Father, you do not have family nearby, but you have said that Benedict XVI is like having a grandfather at home. Do you continue to see him as a grandfather?"

I find this response to be amazing. It says a lot about Church and history, but it also says something essential about Family.

Pope Francis responded: "More than I used to. Every time I visit him I take his hand and get him to talk. He speaks only little and goes slowly, but with the same depth as always. He has a great lucidity, as always. When I hear him speak, I become strong. I hear this history of the Church, which is not something like a museum. Tradition is like a root which gives us the juice to grow. Tradition doesn't turn us into roots. We flower, grow, give fruit, and we become seeds and eventually the roots for others. The tradition of the Church is always in motion.

"Andrea Monda, reflecting on the musician Gustav Mahler, spoke of tradition. He said it's the guarantee of the future and not the keeper of ashes. The tradition is not a museum. Tradition does not preserve ashes. The fundamentalists are nostalise and want to return to the ashes.
