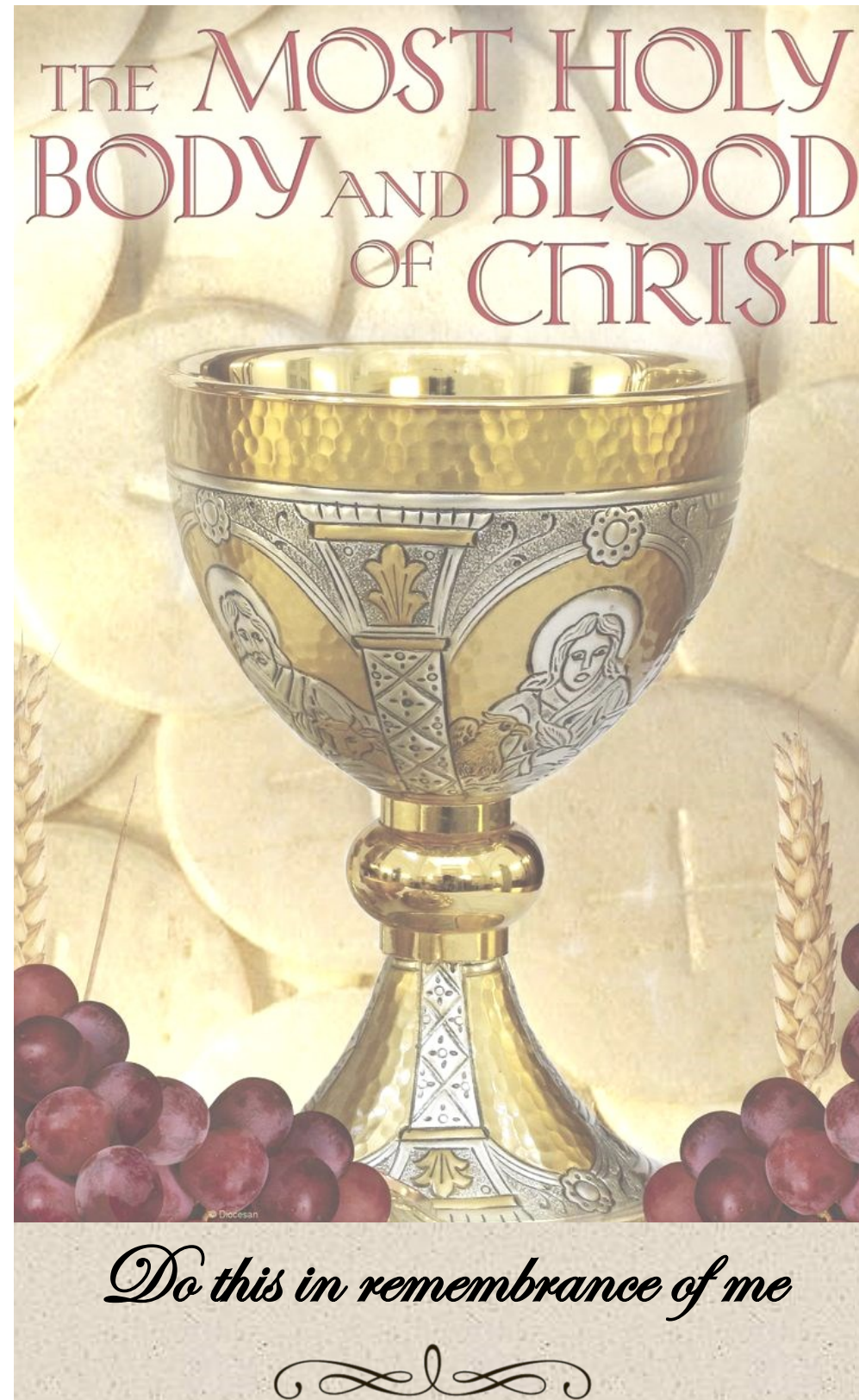

June 22-23, The Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ

From the Pastor's Pen



WHY CHRIST COMES. Since the first days of the Church, Christians have gathered every week for this sacred event, which is both a sacrifice and a meal. Any repeated action is threatened by routine. We have to be careful not to lose sight of the wonder the Eucharist deserves.

This is why the Church sets aside a day, this Solemnity of Christ's Body & Blood, to pause and reflect on what the Lord has gathered us to

do and be. In this Holy, Heavenly Banquet we become one with Christ, and are transformed into his Body, and let his Blood flow in our veins to strengthen us to be his witnesses in the world.

The Gospel from Luke helps us see the Eucharist within the pattern of Jesus' ministry around meals, sometimes mass feedings.

The Mass is an encounter with a transformation, the Spirit comes down and changes the goods of this present world (bread, wine, us). The bread and the wine become Christ's Body & Blood, and when eaten, we become Christ to one another. This is our journey of faith.

In the Gospel, Jesus feeds his followers to give them strength along the way. Every time we gather for the Eucharist, we admit that we're pilgrims in need of the food only God can provide, the only food that can nourish a journey whose destination is Out of this World. But also within this world, by entering repeatedly this transformation, we are becoming more Christ-like and hopefully making our common home, Earth, more like the Kingdom.

For the Hebrew people, eating was how they strengthened family ties. Just a generation ago, that seemed to be the norm for us too. It still can be, but the family meal is under siege. Look back over this week, were there any meals eaten alone or on the run by, or how about in front of the television?

What are you hungry for? Besides food, are you hungry for company, for stronger family ties, for meaningful conversation, for love, laughter, or someone to understand you?

The Food that Jesus serves, the focus of today's Feast, is his offer to satisfy your deeper needs, your hidden hungers. This is the way faith works: if you come truly hungry, you will leave satisfied. This is why he comes.
