

From the Pastor's Pen



BEING SENT. Picking up where last Sunday's Gospel left off, using strong language about what it means to be a disciple, Jesus sends 72 people to go ahead of him to every town and place he plans to visit. Their job: to proclaim the arrival of the Kingdom of God. They go in pairs. If they go as lambs among wolves, with nothing on them, it's so they can enter any town or home as a healing presence and proclaim plain and simple Peace.

When they return, they are so happy. They're rejoicing. They felt demons falling at the name of Jesus. This account describes in the simplest terms the great rewards of following Christ: happiness and freedom from the oppression of evil.

Sharing in Jesus' mission remains difficult, but the rewards remain as well. Pray the master of the harvest to send out workers for his harvest—not to make life more miserable, but more rewarding.

What if you knew the Lord was following in your wake? Wouldn't that motivate you to get out there, do your best, but also not worry if you didn't get it perfect?

When the Lord tells us that the "harvest is rich", that means we should approach people with reverence and admiration. It is easy to pre-judge people. If we must, let's pre-judge them as a 'rich harvest', that is a people of great value and dignity whom our heavenly Father looks upon as His children destined to a forever place in His Kingdom.

Such perspectives are healthy and helpful to both the evangelizers and those to be evangelized.

Our Sunday gatherings at the Eucharist rekindle our call to go forth and prepare the way for Jesus in our world today. We follow Jesus for our salvation, but also in order to present him fresh and real to the world.

INDEPENDENCE DAY, PART II. This week we celebrated the most important day in American history. 243 years ago, 56 British land-owning men signed a watershed document in a little-known Pennsylvania colony. Our 4th of July celebrations honor the signing of the *Declaration of Independence* by our Founding Fathers on 4 July 1776. This document would pave the future of a great Nation, the United States of Ameri-

How are Catholic Christians supposed to celebrate this great day? John Adams, one of the Founding Fathers of our country, wrote about how to celebrate the fourth of July.

It ought to be commemorated as the Day of Deliverance by solemn Acts of Devotion to God Almighty. It ought to be solemnized with Pomp and Parade, with shows, games, Sports, Guns, Bells, Bonfires and illuminations from one End of this Continent to the other from this Time forward forever more."

We owe thanks to God more than to anyone else for what is happening as we declare the blessings of Freedom. The most famous part of the Declaration of Independence points to God as the source of our free-

"We hold these truths to be self-evident, that all men are created equal, that they are endowed by their Creator with certain unalienable rights, that among these are life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness."

Not our parents, or politicians, or government, is the source of our most important rights. Only God.

There are many ways to honor God on this special day. Read a passage from the Bible or pray a decade of the Rosary for our political leaders and our Country's future. Maybe you could pray this simple prayer for our Nation written by George Washington:

Almighty God, who has given us this good land for our heritage: We humbly beseech you that we may always prove ourselves a people mindful of your favor and glad to do your will. Bless our land with honorable industry, sound learning, and pure manners. Save us from violence, discord, and confusion; from pride and arrogance, and from every evil way.

Defend our liberties, and fashion into one united people the multitudes brought hither out of many kindreds and tongues. Endue with the spirit of wisdom those to whom your Name we entrust the authority of government, that there may be justice and peace at home, and that, through obedience to your law, we may show forth your praise
