From the Pastor's Pen



HOSPITALITY. Abraham and Sarah, the parents of Israel, camp under a tree. Three men turn up unex-



pectedly. We come to see that they're angelic visitors mysteriously embodying the Divine Presence. Abraham offers them hospitality, insisting that they rest in the shade. Sarah preps a meal.

The guests ask about her. The elderly couple have no kids and are well beyond child-bearing years. Still, the guests promise she'll be with child, which causes Sarah to laugh while hiding in her tent: "Now that I am worn out and my husband is old, am I still to have sexual pleasure?" The visitor perks up and asks, "Why did

Sarah laugh?" She denies it, but the visitor says, "Yes, you did."

Then comes the point of the story: "Is anything too marvellous for the Lord to do?" The angel Gabriel speaks these same words to Mary in announcing that Elizabeth, another childless and elderly woman, would bear a child (Lk 1:17). Sarah would bear Isaac (a name derived from Hebrew word for laughter), proving that God is way funnier than we can imagine, and brings abundant life in unexpected ways.

The Gospel of Mary & Martha, where a meal is also in the background, is about another kind of hospitality and another kind of abundance. Yet, in a sense, it's the same guest, the Divine Presence, this time in the person of Jesus.

Martha is a good servant and preps the food. Mary sits at the Master's feet "listening to him," and she has chosen the "better part."

As the Church becomes more aware of the essential role of women in carrying out its mission, it's good to acknowledge how often they lead the way in healing and teaching and showing us what it looks like to choose the better part—the one that brings abundant life.

Food is often the reason we gather. Hospitality has a way of operating through the offering of food and drink. As in our homes or while camping, so too in Church.

Jesus comes as Food and Drink. His mild rebuke to Martha is not against the meal, but he is making a point: enjoying their company and loving them is more important than feeding them. We don't want to be so busy we don't have time for conversation.

You never know who your guests might *really be*. You could be entertaining Angels unawares (Heb 13:2).

Hass

Some ask, "What does it mean to have a Mass 'offered' for someone?"

An individual may can call the parish office and request a Mass to be offered for several reasons: for example, in thanksgiving, for the intentions of another person (a birthday or anniversary), or for someone's recovery, or for the repose of the soul of someone who has died.

In 1902, Pope Leo XIII wrote about the connection between the communion of saints through the Mass:

The grace of mutual love among the living, strengthened and increased by the sacrament of the Eucharist, flows, especially by virtue of the Sacrifice of the Mass, to all who belong to the communion of saints. For the communion of saints is simply the mutual sharing of help, prayers and benefits among the faithful: between those already in the Heaven, those in the purifying fires, and those still making their pilgrim way here on Earth. These all form one city, whose head is Christ, and whose vital principle is Love.

The tradition of offering Masses for others, particularly the dead, started in the very early Church. Inscriptions on tombs of 2nd century Roman catacombs beg for prayers for the repose of their souls.

When a priest offers Mass, he has three intentions: First, to offer the Mass reverently according to the mind of the Church. Second, to offer the Mass in union with the whole Church and for the salvation of the whole world. Third, to offer the Mass for any particular intention, as specified.

At Mass, we come face to face with Christ on the Cross and Risen from the grave—the Great Paschal Mystery.

When we face the death of someone, even a person who is not Catholic, to pray for them and/or have a Mass offered for the repose of their soul is more beneficial and comforting than any sympathy card or bouquet of flowers. To have a Mass offered on the occasion of a birth-day, anniversary or special need is an ideal way to unite our earthly events to the great drama of Salvation and make the Lord the front and center of our lives.
