

From the Pastor's Pen



A LITTLE HISTORY OF FIRE. In the Hebrew Scriptures, Divine Fire represents the presence of God. Sometimes God's Being is a flaming presence:

And I saw something like polished metal, like the appearance of fire enclosed on all sides, from what looked like the waist up; and from what looked like the waist down, I saw something like the appearance of fire and brilliant light surrounding him, Ez 1:27.

Smoke rose in his nostrils, a devouring fire from his mouth; it kindled coals into flame, 2 Sm 22:9.

As I watched, thrones were set up and the Ancient of Days took his throne. His clothing was white as snow, the hair on his head like pure wool; his throne was flames of fire, with wheels of burning fire. A river of fire surged forth, flowing from where he sat; thousands upon thousands were ministering to him, and myriads upon myriads stood before him.

The court was convened, and the books were opened, Dn 7:9-10.

Sometimes, the fire itself is God's or His messenger's appearance, as in

There the angel of the LORD appeared to him as fire flaming out of a bush. When he looked, although the bush was on fire, it was not being consumed, Ex 3:2.

Now Mount Sinai was completely enveloped in smoke, because the LORD had come down upon it in fire. The smoke rose from it as though from a kiln, and the whole mountain trembled violently, Ex 19:18.

You came near and stood at the foot of the mountain, while the mountain blazed to the heart of the heavens with fire and was en-

veloped in a dense black cloud. Then the LORD spoke to you from the midst of the fire. You heard the sound of the words, but saw no form; there was only a voice, Dt 4:11-12.

For the LORD, your God, is a consuming fire, a jealous God, Dt 4:24.

As they walked on still conversing, a fiery chariot and fiery horses came between the two of them, and Elijah went up to heaven in a whirlwind, 2 Kings 2:11.

"I came to cast fire upon the earth. How I wish that it was already ablaze!"

Luke 12:49

Fire was essential to worship, a gateway through which earthly offerings entered the heavenly realm:

The Most Powerul Weapon on Earth

is the Human Soul on Fire

While Manoah and his wife were looking on, as the flame rose to the heavens from the altar, the angel of the LORD ascended in the flame of the altar. When Manoah and his wife saw this, they fell on their faces to the ground, Judges 13:20.

When Solomon had ended his prayer, fire came down from heaven and consumed the burnt offerings and the sacrifices, and the glory of the LORD filled the house. But the priests could not enter the house of the LORD, for the glory of the LORD filled the house of the LORD. All the Israelites looked on while the fire came down and the glory of the LORD was upon the house, and they fell down upon the pavement with their faces to the earth and worshiped, praising the LORD, "who is so good, whose love endures forever, 2 Chr 7:1-3.

When Jesus journeyed toward Jerusalem, his ministry brought with it the whole history of divine Fire. Through the call to discipleship, the Sacraments, the Scriptures, aid to the poor, his Fire burns in our hearts and through us continues what he ignited: setting the world ablaze.

Here is a definition that generally describes the prayer shawl:

"Purpose: Prayer shawls are created to be a comfort for those suffering from mental, physical or emotional difficulties. Those who create these prayer shawls -- through crochet, knit, weave or tying -- give their time and service as an act of prayer for the ones who will use their shawls. They pray for healing, peace and knowledge of God's loving presence."

We have about 30-35 services each year. That means that we need 30-35 prayer shawls per year as well.

Would your congregation want to ensure that we have enough prayer shawls by making some for us this year?
