

From the Pastor's Pen



CARE FOR THE POOR. This is a major theme in Luke's Gospel. We heard about it last week, and it appears again in today's parable. Jesus speaks of poor Lazarus and a rich man. They both die. In the afterlife, their fortunes are reversed.

Sometimes at the beginning of Mass we recite the *Confiteor*: "I confess to Almighty God and to you, my brothers and sisters, that I have greatly sinned, in my thoughts and in my words, in what I have done *and in what I have failed to do....*"

We cannot spend life wringing our hands over the millions of good works we've left undone. Still, Jesus reminds us, there are those close to our door who need our help. If we turn from them, we'll have to answer for that.

Who are these folks? What situations might these be? The fate of the rich man strongly suggests that it's better to ask now than to find out later.

It might only be a partial answer, but it's a good one—many of these people and situations are currently be addressed by our local Church through ND Catholic Charities

In this year's video we hear the story of a teenager who was in foster care for years. After going through 3 different foster homes he was finally adopted, calling it the best decision he ever made. We also learn of a man with intellectual disabilities and his guardian at Catholic Charities who helped him navigate difficult housing and health issues. We also hear about disaster relief aid provided by Catholic Charities and how it helps rural North Dakota communities struck by floods, tornadoes, and wind storms.
