





# From the Pastor's Pen





A MODEL CHRISTIAN. Both this week and next, Advent will feed on the figure of John the Baptist.

John is a fascinating figure. He stuck out like a sore thumb. While he was in the desert, he could stick out and nobody noticed. Then came his mission to the people. He came among them remaining in his desert garb. He came with a radical message: "Repent!"

John was so different from Jesus. Jesus didn't stand out for most of his life. He was tucked away in the hidden life of Nazareth, Mary and Joseph's stay-at-

Yet Jesus loved John very much. John's ministry was totally at the service of Christ, "He must increase, I must decrease" (Jn 3:30).

Christians, baptized in the Holy Spirit and fire, echo Jesus' love for John by loving John's message of repentance. We're still preparing the way of the Lord.

John's baptism anticipates Christian baptism. John even alludes to the difference between his baptism and the one to come: "I am baptizing you with water, for repentance . . . He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and Fire" (Mt 3:11).

The coming of the Lord is the key to Advent. Like John, our lives announce the coming of the Lord.

Model planes and cars, etc. were popular Christmas gifts when I was a kid. They came with instructions. You wanted to cheat, take short-cuts, but usually learned it worked best to follow the enclosed diagram.

Because the diagram was so helpful, and showed what the model would be, why not just hang up the instructions? Why do we prefer the finished product?

John's job was to tell the people that Jesus was coming. He was like the diagram. He was important. He instructed the people how to prepare for Jesus' coming. But he wasn't nearly as important as Jesus was.

So, shouldn't this make us wonder, how am I a different person for being baptized in the Holy Spirit and Fire?

If we're not done working with the Holy Spirit in building our Christian identity, we probably shouldn't throw out the instructions. Repentance still has a purpose in our lives, unless of course we already consider ourselves to be a 'model' Christian.

COMMUNAL PENANCE SERVICE. John's call to repentance is met in an important way by celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation. If you missed ours at St. Mark's last Sunday, there are several more in our local area over the next few weeks.




Support aging religious. Our second collection is for the Retirement Fund for Religious. Many senior Catholic sisters, brothers, and religious
