

From the Pastor's Pen



at what you see,

your heart shall throb & overflow, for the riches of

the sear shall be emptied out before you, the wealth

of nations shall be brought to you

RIPPLES OF LIGHT. The Magi show Christ's mission to the rest of the world.

In the 2nd reading, St. Paul speaks of the revelation of a mystery: that all nations are to share in the inheritance of Israel and become Then you shall be parts of the Body of Christ.

Isaiah, 1st reading, shares with us a vision of Jerusalem's magnetic attraction. He sees lines of camels, and kings with their peoples streaming toward Jerusalem. As the citizens behold the mounting influx of humanity they glow, their radiance intensifies and their hearts throb with joy.

This startling, beautiful image condenses the whole history of the Church into a single event. Perhaps you've seen crowds descending upon the Fargo Dome or some big stadium. I recall the March for Life in Wash D.C., and especially the opening of the Holy Door in Rome on Xmas Eve, 1999.

Baby Jesus begins a global procession. Funny how quietly it began. The Magi follow a star to a humble abode where they find Mother & Child wrapped in silence. They prostrate themselves, offering gifts. From there a ripple effect gradually spreads over the entire world.

Let's bring it home. How open (or closed) are your relationships to outside enrichment?

Are newcomers impressed by the spirit of welcome they encounter in our community?

Is my circle of friends within a picket fence others can peer through, observe the love, and draw close to the gate that easily swings open?

As a parish, our identity is Christ. We are his Body. We are to become what we eat. We are Christ to one another. We are Christ to strangers, to newcomers, even to enemies.

In our own humble and quiet ways we all have something to receive from one another. How else will the global procession continue its forward march toward the Kingdom of God?

To belong to this "caravan", mentioned by Isaiah, is to belong to a vast movement that is far from done wrapping our world. Like a symphony or a pilgrimage, it unfolds. It is the unfolding of Love. The Good Shepherd is conducting this concert, leading this march.

Such a Love is a Star worth following. It is the glow of Christmas that shines year round, weaving a radiance that shines with the fibers of your choices and your life in Christ. This is an ongoing *Epiphany*.

Actually, to me the most astonishing part of the story of the Magi is not that they would predict the birth of a king from the positions of the planets; any fortune teller could have done that kind of calculation. Nor is it that they'd pull up roots and travel afar to find out if they were right; we astronomers do that all the time. Instead,

it's that they would be able and willing to recognise the king they were seeking in the child they found in a manger.

Are we able and willing to recognize the Child in the manger?

EPIPHANY HOME BLESSING

All: Make the Sign of the Cross.

Leader: "Peace be to this house and to all who dwell here, in the name of the Lord."

All: Blessed be God forever.

Reader: In the beginning was the Word and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came to be through him, and without him nothing came to be. And the Word became flesh and dwelt among us, and we saw his glory, the glory as of the Father's only Son, full of grace and truth (John 1:1-3.14).

Using the blessed chalk, write on the lintel of one or more of your household doorways (each number/letter could be written by a different member of the family): The first half of the current year: + 20, Then the three letters: C + M + B, Lastly, write the other half of the year: 20 +. It should look something like this: +20 C + M + B 20 +

The initials stand for Christus mansionem benedicat, which means: "May Christ bless this house". They also recall the traditional names of the three Magi: Caspar, Melchior, Balthazar.

Final prayer:

Leader: Lord God of heaven and earth,

you revealed your beloved Son

to every nation by the guidance of a star.

Bless this house and all who dwell here.

May we be blessed with health, goodness of heart,

gentleness and the keeping of your law.

Fill us with the light of Christ so our love for each other can go out to all. We ask this through Christ our Lord. Amen.
