## Process of Consideration and Final Adoption

1. Development of the proposal (December 2019)
2. Review and change where indicated by District 10 County Representatives (Realignment Committee, late December 2019)
3. Dissemination to schools for review (Late December 2019/Early January 2020)
4. Review and change where indicated and final adoption by the District 10 Committee (January 2020)

## Region Realignment Proposal Will Contain

## Information by sport:

1. Classification cutoff numbers
2. Number of teams in District 10 in each classification by sport
3. PIAA Calculated Classifications for each school in each Region
4. Teams playing up have $\mathrm{a}+$ next to them
5. Co-op teams have a ${ }^{* *}$ next to them
6. Current cycle (2018-2020) region breakdown
7. Proposal of region outline by sport for 2020-2022
8. School enrollment numbers

## Considerations and general principles utilized for Re-alignment:

1. Number of total teams in a classification.
2. Reasonable size of regions (and therefore reasonable number of region games) given the total number of games permitted for each individual sport.
3. Reasonable opportunities for tournaments and other non-league scheduling in appropriate sports.
4. Geography as much as possible.
5. No region will have teams spanning 3 classifications with the possible exception of where there are limited teams of largest classification.
6. Subject to the exception of $\# 5$ above sports purity in classification is problematic.
a. Sports with Six Classifications: 1A and 2A may be in the same region or crossscheduled to create a reasonable schedule, 2 A and 3 A may be in the same region or cross-scheduled to create a reasonable schedule, 3A and 4A may be in the same region or cross-scheduled to create a reasonable schedule. 4A and 5A may be in the same region or cross-scheduled to create a reasonable schedule.
b. Sports with Four Classifications: 1A and 2A may be in the same region or crossscheduled to create a reasonable schedule. 2 A and 3 A may be in the same region or cross-scheduled to create a reasonable schedule and, 3A and 4Amay be in the same region or cross-scheduled to create a reasonable schedule.
c. Sports with Three Classifications: 1A and 2A may be in the same region or crossscheduled to create a reasonable schedule. 2A and 3A may be in the same region or cross-scheduled to create a reasonable schedule.
d. Sports with Two Classifications: 2A and 3A may be in the same region or crossscheduled to create a reasonable schedule.
e. Single classified team in a Region: it is never preferable to have only one team of a classification in a Region with teams of another classification. There does exits the possibility where given a circumstance of extreme geographical consideration, the placement of a single classified team in a Region may occur. For example: There is only one single 1A team in a given sport in northern Erie county where the only other 1A teams are in southern Mercer County. That single 1A team in Erie County may end up being a single classified team with 2A teams in a Region in Erie County.
