 ${f P}$ erhaps the more familiar obstacle for many in this life, rather than being where to find the remedy for our pain, or relief for our burdens, is rather, how. In America, while we do frequently see dental practices, hospitals, urgent care clinics, eve clinics, and various specialists, for many, the hurdle to inaccessibility overcome is and unaffordability.

It is for this reason that the Remote Area Medical Volunteer Corps (RAM) exists. Through this organization, people are able to receive medical attention *at no cost to them.* On the weekend of March 3rd – 4th, Southeastern Food Bank, amongst others, had the pleasure and joy of joining their initiative at the Eustis Fairgrounds. This event was truly *beautiful.* 

Several hundred locals, some coming from as far as Albany, GA, flocked to the fairgrounds as early as 8 pm the night previous (10 hours early) to register for dental, vision and medical assistance. Lines of tables (see above photo) with experienced professionals and equipment awaited to receive as many clients as time would permit.

Over the course of hours between these two days, Southeastern Food Bank was able to provide boxes of food and counseling to over 50 of these families! But upon sitting down with these individuals and listening to their respective stories, a common thread became clear: our deepest need far exceeds that of the physical. Grief, guilt, indifference, resentment, distrust, and confusion are all symptoms of the heart that frequently surfaced in our conversations that weekend.

While we may be comfortable with reasoning this as merely being an isolated statistic for those residents in Eustis, if we are honest and sensible, each of us would have to identify with having felt the same

symptoms in our own lives. Our hearts are marked with a history of stains and blemishes, bruises and scars. It's proof that we, surely, are in desperate need of a cure from the inside-out. We need restoration from the spiritual physician, Christ Jesus.



But for those who are weak and heavy laden, who need cure for their helpless estate, He calls out to them, saying

"Come, and I will give you rest".
