### **AUTHORITY**

- 1. To be eligible for an award an exhibit must not, in the opinion of the judge, exhibit any lameness. In all events, the judge's decision is final
- 2. Any protest must be in writing and lodged within 1 hour of the alleged violation of rules. A deposit of \$50.00 must accompany the protest and will be forfeited if the protest is dismissed.
- 3. The Committee reserves the right to alter the program as necessary.
- 4. All competitors must be a current financial member of the AHSA
- 5. The committee reserves the right to refuse entry to any person or persons without giving due reason
- 6. If any AHSA or affiliate member is convicted of animal mistreatment their membership status will be revoked from AHC and will be ineligible to compete
- 7. Code of Behaviour card system will be in place at this show
- 8. Bullying and Harassment of any competitor, judge or official in any form will not be tolerated. Any person that brings the Arabian horse or community into disrepute will be banned from competing at this show.

#### **GENERAL**

- 9. The Committee is running all Arabian/Arabian Derivative classes under the current AHSA Rule Book (please refer to the AHSA website/Rule Book if you require any further information <a href="http://www.ahsa.asn.au/">http://www.ahsa.asn.au/</a>).
- 10. All horses must be under control at all times. Any horse that is loose in the arena may be disqualified.
- 11. For the purpose of this show, a NOVICE is a horse that has not won a 1st place in a novice or open event at an A class or higher-level show. MUST be ridden in an EA approved Snaffle Bridle ONLY.
- 12. All competitors compete at their own risk.
- 13. The age of horses is calculated from 1 August.
- 14. The Arena is not to be used for exercising of horses prior to or during competition unless authorised. Arena familiarisation will take place and time will be published at show
- 15. Approximate section times will be provided when entries have closed
- 16. Classes may be combined if there is insufficient entries or may be split if numbers warrant
- 17. Heats may be conducted if entries exceed 12 per class in halter and 10 for ridden classes
- 18. One handler and one groom in marshalling area only
- 19. Shakers are permitted under the AHSA guidelines
- 20. Personal Liability it is advisable that competitors/handlers/strappers ensure they have adequate Personal Liability insurance for this event. If not a member of AHC Inc, AHSA or EA competitors/handlers/riders/helpers must pay an additional insurance fee. Competitors must be wearing an AHC wristband to compete
- 21. Entries open on 15th June 2018 and close on *3rd September 2018* via global online entries (entries can be paid off overtime) https://www.globalentriesonline.com.au/
- 22. NO REFUNDS WILL BE GIVEN, unless accompanied by a vet certificate
- 23. PLEASE NOTE: AGE OF COMPETITORS IS AS OF CLOSING DATE OF ENTRIES
- 24. Proof of Registration may be required when collecting competitor bags.
- 25. If competing in a height class the height certificate must be emailed at time of entry, horses will not be accepted into the ring without it, <u>NO measuring</u> will take place at this show

- 26. Youth competing in youth classes are unable to compete in open speciality classes (Western, Costume, Stock horse, hunter, bridlepath etc..) where there is a specific youth class API horses may compete in Youth classes
- 27. Non pro halter classes are for owners only and must be shown by the owner of the horse. (A full non pro program will be at Young Stars of the future show) There is to be no training of horses in marshalling area, the owner is the only person allowed on the end of the lead.
- 28. Exhibits must be entered as per Registration Certificate (ie in current owner(s) name).
- 29. NO PENDING REGISTRATIONS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED.
- 30. If a horse leaves the workout area, other than at the direction of a judge or official, it will entail elimination from that class.
- 31. Grounds contribution will be allocated to additional drags/water of arena, heated wash bays and additional lighting after curfew if required.
- 32. Administration costs assist in covering some of the expenses for various office supplies, equipment and advertising, exhibitor numbers and swabbing.

### STALLIONS AND COLTS

- 33. Handlers and Riders of stallions must be 18 years and over.
- 34. Stallions may compete in all relevant Classes.
- 35. Handlers who incite stallions to challenge each other will be asked to leave the arena.

#### CLASS DESCRIPTIONS

- 36. Stock horse classes Mandatory to carry & use a stock whip
- 37. Endurance horse class Must have yellow or blue log book, must be presented when picking up competitor packs
- 38. Bridle Path worked on a circle, class require a rein back
- 39. Sporthorse inhand class Must be presented as a hunter style, no bling browbands, plain cable halter may be used, minimal makeup (heavy makeup and balding may be penalised) A horse displaying bad manners may be asked to exit the ring, horses not under proper control will be issued a warning, A horse that canters, trots sideways or spins will be penalised. Natural pose is required, should be relaxed but attentive. Handler must be dressed in conservative casual attire, this would include casual pants and shirt. Also acceptable is dressage or show hunter attire, a whip may be carried and used to guide the horse only.
- 40. Newcomer classes A horse that has not competed under saddle in any state prior to 1st January 2018, A horse that has competed in breed classes under saddle is not eligible to be considered a Newcomer. The horse must be shown in a snaffle bridle
- 41. Membership halter classes stand up will be a natural pose but attentive, hard stand up will be penalised
- 42. API registered horses can only compete in classes specifically for API horses and are not eligible for Grand Champion or jackpot classes unless stated. API may compete in youth classes and champion of champions where applicable
- 43. Breed halter ring will consist of 2 judges, Judges will not be allowed to converse and will have their own steward. One judge will be Australian and one judge will be International. (subject to change)
- 44. Double Diamond Gelding Challenge is for Purebred and Derivative Arabian Geldings 4 yrs & over (must be entered in another ridden class)
- 45. Ridden Novice Sweepstakes qualifier All first place winners from classes #98-#103 compete in the Novice sweepstakes final. \*API eligible

- 46. Makeher Jazz Memorial Ultimate Cup Open to Purebreds 4 yrs of age and over, to compete in 2 sections, Halter and ridden. Same handler/rider must compete in both sections. One horse, one rider. Halter class is natural pose, no hard stand up. Ridden class attire must consist of the following: Horse: Double bridle with bit and bradoon, numnah, Plain browband and cavesson noseband, Halter bridle or show halter optional, must be plain in appearance.. Plaiting is optional. Rider: Must be 14yrs and over, No hunter jackets. Stock and gloves must be worn. Cane optional, no whips in halter or ridden,. Top boots or gaiters, Top hats optional. Hair must be worn in a bun with a hairnet, No jewellery
- 47. Derivative Jackpot Ridden Challenge Open to all derivatives, 4 yrs and over (must be entered in another ridden class) to compete in 2 sections, Halter and ridden. Same handler/rider must compete in both sections. One horse, one rider. Halter class is natural pose, no hard stand up. Ridden class attire must consist of the following: Horse: Double bridle with bit and braddon, numnah, Plain browband and cavesson noseband, Halter bridle or show halter optional, must be plain in appearance.. Plaiting is optional Rider: Must be over the age of 18yrs, No hunter jackets. Stock and gloves must be worn. Cane optional, no whips in halter or ridden,. Top boots or gaiters, Top hats optional. Hair must be worn in a bun with a hairnet, No jewellery
- 48. Shiranna Garlands Diamond Award for Derivatives Halter 50% & over. Top 5 with winner being chosen from line up. Open to all ages
- 49. Bingham Training Ranch Western Pleasure event competitors are to complete Pattern 2 which can be downloaded from our website. Tack and appointments are optional between English Pleasure (AHSA rule 22.1) OR Western Pleasure (AHSA rule 25.2) Horses must be 4 yrs 8 over

#### **AWARDS**

- 50. Diamond, Ruby and Emerald Champion prizes will be awarded from both judges in all breed halter classes
- 51. Double Diamond High Point and runner up will automatically be awarded to the highest scoring horse from each halter breed class section, High point winners eligible for Grand Champion
- 52. Diamond, Ruby and Emerald Champion will be the awarded in all ridden breed classes from one judge, winners of Diamond awards compete for Grand Champion
- 53. Diamond, Ruby and Emerald Champions will be awarded to Specialty classes, Youth, non pro, Bridle path and Hunter classes and members classes.
- 54. Head and trot classes will be awarded 1st -3rd place
- 55. Jackpot cash classes are awarded as 50% to winner, 30% to runner up and 20% to AHC from total pool.
- 56. Novice Sweepstakes qualifiers will be placed 1<sup>st</sup>-5<sup>th</sup>, Winners from class #99-#104 are eligible to compete in the Sweepstakes final. Sweepstake class payouts will be on a sliding scale dependable on entries and will be disclosed at close of entries.
- 57. Makeher Jazz Memorial Ultimate Cup Award consists of winner and places to 6th
- 58. Double Diamond Purebred vs Derivative Gelding Challenge Winner and Places to 5th
- 59. Double Diamond Jackpot Ridden Derivative challenge Winner and places to 5th
- 60. Double Diamond Halter presentation includes any exhibit that receives 2 Diamond placings from both judges in the same Halter breed section.
- 61. DD High point winner and runner up is presented to the highest point score for that section. All high point winners compete for DD Highpoint Grand Champion

- 62. DD Grand Champion Halter exhibit includes all high point winners from breed halter. (Separate Grand Champion for Purebred and Derivatives) (API not eligible) Prize consists of Garland, Rug and a frame with photo of your choice from our Show Photographer.
- 63. DD Grand Champion Ridden exhibit is all champions from breed ridden classes (separate Purebred and derivative Grand champion). Prize consists of Garland, Rug and a frame with photo of your choice from our Show Photographer.
- 64. Champion of Champion awards are for all Diamond winners in that section to compete in.
- 65. Double Diamond Trilogy Award is given to competitors that have received 3 Diamond Champions, one in Halter breed, one in Ridden Breed, one Specialty class. Prize consists of Garland and Cash prize money, photo frame with photo of your choice from our show photographer
- 66. Shiranna Garlands Diamond Award for Derivatives Halter 50% & over.Jackpot of 50% to winner
- 67. Handler showmanship award Judged on showmanship throughout the show

#### **SCORING**

Ridden Challenges with two judges - Judges must stand separately and judge with no consultation amongst them. At the conclusion of the workouts the two judges mark their first, second and third choices on a preferential judging slip and hand it to the steward. Results are taillied based on a point system from both judges, winners will then be announced.

Halter - Two Judges score via electronic scoresheet (this is done electronically to avoid mistakes).. The two judges must not come together. The Horses with the highest score will be awarded as Diamond Champion, Ruby Champion and Emerald Champion

The horse with the highest number of points from each section will be awarded High Point, with the next score being awarded High Point runner up. The two judges will continue to stand separately until the scorers have determined that there is no equality. Where the allocation of points brings about a tie, the following steps must occur:

- a) If there is an equality of points by any 2 horses (if 2 way tie refer to part f) then it must go back to the judges to decide.
- b) This is to be done by writing down the numbers of the horses on equal points on separate pieces of paper and the ringmaster/chief steward is to request the judges mark their preferences accordingly.
- c) These pieces of paper are to be retained with the original scoring sheets.
- d) If a clear placing cannot be achieved using this method then and only then will the judges be brought together to come to a decision.
- e) If the judges are brought together to decide then the chief steward is to be present during discussions.
- f) In the event of 2 horses being tied then the judges may confer to decide on the winner and runner-up

### STABLING

Is to be booked directly through K ranch via nominate

Stables cost \$30 (3m x 3m) or \$45 (3.6m x 3.6m) per night and INCLUDE shavings. Additional shavings can be purchased for \$15 through shop at K Ranch

Outside stabling with dirt floor and with no roof are available for \$10
