

Families First Coronavirus Response Act

The US House of Representatives and the US Senate have passed an economic stimulus package. This bill responds to the COVID-19 (i.e., coronavirus disease 2019) outbreak by providing paid sick leave, tax credits, and free COVID-19 testing; expanding food assistance and unemployment benefits; and increasing Medicaid funding. <u>Click Here</u> to view the entire act.
