Our facilities include a pavilion with stone fireplace that can house up to 80 people. There is a kitchen structure; a riding ring; round pen; small stall barn; and flush toilets.

Our season of organized events usually runs from mid April to mid November. Scheduled events usually include various meals and activities, and a trail ride. You may join a group ride, led by one of our trail bosses, or go your own way with a few friends. Once a year we have a "Fun Day" with games on horseback in our riding ring. These games/classes are maximum on the fun and laughs and minimum on the competition.

In addition to events at our own camp Glazier, we are usually invited to two or three events at other locations.
