
2019 Dues, Lot Rentals and Suggested Donations



At our September meeting, the subject of membership categories, dues and fees for 2019 were discussed along with the need to ensure we bring in enough funds to cover some of the maintenance needs at Camp Glazier (tree removal, road repair, lawn mowing, etc.) It has been reported by the Vice President and other members that the requirement for married couples to join as a family has been a barrier in recruiting new members when one is a non-rider.

This subject is one of interest for many members. Members continued exchanging thoughts and ideas when gathering for the events held after the September meeting. It was also discussed at a meeting earlier in the year. Based on those discussions, the takeaways seem to be:

- Married couples should not be required to join as a family esp. as there are many instances where one or more members of a family do not participate in equine activities.
- We need to remove barriers to membership.
- Some of our dues should go up.
- We want to present ourselves as a family-friendly organization even to family members who
 are not involved in equine activities.
- Lot rental fees should go up but not too drastically.
- We should be competitive with our dues, lot rentals and event fees.
- We provide a lot of value in that members (including those who do not rent a lot) have unlimited access to grounds outside of events.
- Non-members (including non-member family and friends) need to pay more than members for events.
- We should provide day corrals for a fee for members and non-members who wish to spend the day without keeping their horses tied to a trailer.
- Keep it simple with respect to dues, lot rentals and suggested donations for events and lot rentals.
- We need to recognize that maintaining the building and grounds takes money and time, both
 of which are in short supply, and ensure that we are able to generate the funds necessary to
 take care of the property, buildings, systems and equipment.





Family Membership - \$50 (current dues are \$70)*

The definition of a family would change to married adults (to include domestic partners, civil unions, etc.) with or without dependent children plus single a dults with dependent children

Single Adult only - \$40 (current dues are \$35 with or without dependent children)*

Lot rentals - \$120 or \$125 (current seasonal rental fees are \$90)

Stall rentals - no discussion of change (current seasonal rental fee is \$25)







Member day corral rental - (\$5.00 per day)

*Supporting Members in these categories pay the same dues as members.

Recommended Guest (Non-Member) Donations

Event participation – additional \$10 (currently non-members contribute the same as members for events

Day stay with horse - \$10 per day (current rate is \$5/day)

Corral day stay - \$10 per day (current rate is \$5/day)

We hope to see as many members as possible at the next meeting so that we can prepare for 2019!
