The prime mover behind the memorial's 40th anniversary was the Memorial Foundation President Paula Sarlls. She worked tirelessly to orchestrate the various aspects of this event. Furthermore, Marine Corps League Marines, FMF Corpsmen, and Auxiliary members worked together to plan, organize an event worthy of a Marine Corps Memorial often referred to as the "The Jewel in Colorado's Golden Crown". Marines have always risen to any challenge presented to them. We are proposing a challenge to you that will have long range benefits to the Marine Corps League and Marine Corps League Auxiliary in Colorado and very possibly a member of your family sometime in the future. Many members have experienced the benefit of a grant from our MCL National Scholarship program for a child or grandchild.
