Form — now that reminds us of something — Ah yes — We must remember to get some charming young lady to present the Helmet tonight.





The four definites - Freeman, Harvey, Greve and Shepherd. *








Ray Revell, 1950, '52 and '56.

here were other tracks equally as important as the Showground, equally terrifying in their own way. Brisbane's

Exhibition Grounds, better known as The Ekka, also had its own unique atmosphere. Looking like a compressed but wider version of the Sydney Showground, it is situated as close to the red lights of Fortitude Valley as the Showground track was to The Cross. Plus, this speedway had the steamy atmosphere of Queensland's tropical climate and, as photographer Warren Bridge vividly remembers, its own colony of speedway bats. They lived in a couple

of giant Moreton bay figs nearby and circulated overhead as if intoxicated by the methanol fumes.

Only a quarter mile around, and nearly circular in shape, the Ekka was considered the best track in Australia for solo motorcycle and sidecar racing. But it also provided some unbelievable speedcar racing, with desperate back-markers scraping the fence for laps at a time in an effort to pass on the outside. Bob Tattersall was a joy to watch here, keeping his car
