
# NEWS

## **SAFETY AND SECURITY AT OUR CHURCH**

With all the mass shootings going on, especially the latest shooting in a Baptist church in Texas Sunday, many of you have expressed concern about our church and whether we have any kind of plan in effect.

Yes, we do have a Safety/Security Team in place. This team is composed of capable, well-trained individuals and are in place on Sunday mornings for all services in the sanctuary. We have met with representatives from Homeland Security, GEMA and representatives from City of Woodstock Police Department. They have gone over our facility and grounds and given an assessment and suggestions of things that we can do to maximize your safety.



The safety of all of you and the security of our church and grounds is of utmost importance and we are working on a more detailed plan to further enhance your safety. We will be implementing new security measures immediately. We also need you to be aware of things going on around you. If you feel something needs to be brought to our attention, please contact us immediately. Be assured that we are very concerned and are working hard to have a plan in effect to handle a bad situation such as active shooter, that we hope never comes to our church. Yet, through you and the team, we still need to be a welcoming and inviting church at the same time, being aware of our surroundings and report promptly anything unusual.





## Old Alabama Rd. (Before it became Highway 92)

It was the Summer of 1946 when the Old Alabama dirt road was worked and top soiled by convict labor from the Cherokee County convict camp. The ditches were pulled, and the roadbed scraped down to a good foundation. The topsoil was hauled from Sweet Mountain to cover the road from Hwy 5 to the Cobb County line. It took several weeks for the work to be finished, a real improvement, a blessing.

When the work was completed, the members of Little River Church, under the direction of Mr. Olin Hames, gave the convicts and the county employees who worked with them, a dinner to show their appreciation. It was held on a Saturday; food was heaped on the tables at the edge of the cemetery, in the shade where homecoming dinners were held. It was a regular banquet and a real treat to the convicts who thoroughly enjoyed the occasion.

Several years later, tar and gravel were spread, and the old road became a real blessing and the name was changed to Highway 92. It was in the early 1900s when the divided four lane highway was built and the busy thoroughfare we see today came into being and some might call it a mixed blessing. We did get a traffic light with this change to help us enter and exit the church yard.

Also during these early days in Cherokee County, there was another county dirt road that led from Old Alabama Road to Neese Road. It started from Old Alabama Road between Little River Church and the cemetery through the churchyard, running north, forded the stream between the church and Trickum Road, crossing Trickum, then on north through woods and fields to dead end on Neese Road about halfway between Arnold Mill Road and Old Alabama Road. This was also the way to the Old Meadow, a lake a swampy area off to the right where the outdoorsmen loved to fish and hunt.

Although most of the hunting was done in the Thousand Acre Woods, west of Woodstock, now known as Town Lake. The fishing was mostly limited to the Old Meadow and Little River.

Everything keeps changing, which is also called progress.
