
Jan. 31 Pork roast, pinto beans, seasoned roasted potatoes, cucumber salad, bread, drink & dessert.

Come on Wednesday nights at 6:15 and enjoy a good meal and fellowship! It is a great way to get to know your church family better.


- Bring your children to Christ's Kids, or the Youth Group, or if they are too small to participate in these two groups, we have a staffed nursery with Pam and Megan.



Cannon and has served as Pastor of churches in the North Georgia Annual Conference for 35 years, most recently as Senior Pastor of Hillside United Methodist in Woodstock, Georgia. He was appointed District Superintendent of the Atlanta Roswell District in 2014 where he currently serves.
