
CHRIST KIDS




SHAKES OUR WORLD


The Mighty Duo! David and Teresa Bailey

From the LRUMC Finance Team

The LRUMC Finance Team has been busy working toward a financially successful year. We began the year by working on our "Spending Plan", usually called a Budget. We realized that with the unsettled feeling of the United Methodist Church as a whole until after the General Conference in February, we did not really know how to plan for 2019. Therefore, we decided to come up with a spending plan allowing all activities and ministries to continue

without change – no additions or subtractions from on-going activities or ministries. We removed all escrows, made reductions and additions only to reflect actual needs for 2019, and agreed to meet again in March to review the current status of our financial condition at that time.

We met on March 21 and reviewed the Revenue and Expense Report for January and February.

We were concerned about the negative balance and decided to come up with a short-term plan to be implemented immediately. We agreed to meet again in May to review this plan and discuss possible long-term changes needed to keep LRUMC financially whole.

The 2019 LRUMC Operating Budget is below and is available for anyone wishing to have a copy, and the current Revenue and Expense Report is also available.
