
## Texas Mourns Loss of Florida HS Coach Aaron Feis

Aaron Feis passed away on February 16th after a shooting in Parkland, Florida.

On Thursday, Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in Parkland, Florida fell victim to one of the deadliest mass shootings in U.S. history.

One of 17 fatalities, M.S. Douglas assistant football coach Aaron Feis died after shielding students from gunfire.

According to his biography on the school's athletic website, Feis graduated from Marjory Stoneman Douglas High School in 1999, returned to the school as a coach in 2002 and served as head coach of the junior varsity team for eight years. He also served as the school's college recruiting coordinator. Support from around the country poured in for Feis and his family as the events of Thursday's tragedy unfolded, including many in the Texas High School Football community.

Colton Haab, a junior player that was close with Feis described him as "selfless, approachable, and friendly."

"He made sure everyone else's needs were met before his own," Haab said to CNN. "He was a hard worker. He worked after school, on the weekends, mowing lawns, just helping as many people as possible."
