

UIL Denies Appeals of Four Football Programs

The ripple effects of Realignment Day 2018 are still impacting the landscape of Texas High School Football as district appeal rulings were finalized and revealed on Tuesday. Of the 10 appeals filed, four of them were football programs that included Fort Worth Trimble Tech, Fort Worth YMLA, Everman and San Angelo Central.

A press release from the UIL stated, "The District Assignment Appeals Committee voted to deny appeals from...Fort Worth Trimble Tech, Fort Worth Young Men's Leadership Academy...San Angelo Central and Everman."

Both Fort Worth Trimble Tech and YMLA will be left in the 6A classification along with Fort Worth Paschal. Per a Star Telegram report, YMLA has an attendance of 177 students as opposed to District 4-6A counterpart Arlington Martin, who has the largest at 3456. Trimble Tech is at 1699 students and both FWISD schools are without attendance zones.

San Angelo Central was one of the other teams that had their appeal denied and will be in a district that is composed of Abilene, Euless Trinity, Haltom, Hurst L.D. Bell, Richland and Weatherford. San Angelo's basketball and volleyball's teams will be playing in the same district and the amount of travel from San Angelo to Euless Trinity (the most western to eastern point of the district) is a 259 mile trip (3 hr 58 min) when going through Abilene.

Everman was also denied their request to move from District 5-5A DII to 4-5A DII.
