Texas lands second commit of the week in Marcus Washington

The Longhorns continue to dominate the recruiting trail, pulling in a commitment from Trinity Catholic (St. Louis, MO) WR **Marcus Washington**. 247 Composite rates Washington as a four-star WR 32nd best at his position and third best player in the state. 247 has him as the three star prospect, 78th best at his position and 12th in the state.

Washington picked Texas out of a top four that also included Nebraska, Ohio State and Missouri. Washington had originally planned on committing over the summer, before pushing his decision back a couple months. Washington made official visits to Nebraska and Texas on September 8th and 15th, respectively. Ultimately, it was Director of Recruiting Bryan Carrington that shouldered the workload in bringing Washington on board.

Suddenly, Texas' 2019 wide receiver room is packed with talent. Cuero's Jordan Whittington is already Division I-ready size wise and could contribute immediately. Jake Smith from Notre Dame Prep might be the fastest player in the locker room next fall. Millwood's Demariyon Houston has been described as a Devin Duvernay clone in his style

of play. Washington brings length to the WR room, listed a 6-2, 191 pounds. While he isn't the fastest receiver, but he makes up for it with his lateral quickness (4.28 shuttle) and explosiveness (32 inch vertical).

This is Texas' second commitment of the week, having pulled in Permian (TX) ATH <u>Peyton</u> <u>Powell</u> earlier this week.
