# From The Pastor's Desk

#### Dear Parishioners,

Attention!!! Beginning on the first weekend of January, the Sunday morning mass schedule will officially change. The new schedule beginning 2018 is: 8:00 a.m., 9:30 a.m. & 11 a.m. Why the change? There are a number of reasons. The most important are: 1. Easier traffic flow in the parking lot for those leaving mass and those arriving for the next mass; 2. More time for the priest presider to gather and socialize with the parishioners; 3. More time for confessions before each mass. Please make note of these changes on your 2018 church calendars. We will have weekly reminders in the parish bulletin and also on the parish website.

The <u>Solemnity of the Immaculate Conception (Dec. 8<sup>th</sup>)</u> falls on a Friday this year. This is a <u>Holy Day of Obligation.</u> The masses are as follows: Thursday, December 7<sup>th</sup> – 4 p.m. Vigil; Friday, December 8<sup>th</sup> – 9 a.m. (with Catholic homeschoolers) and 7 p.m.

Last weekend I decided to use incense at the Sunday masses because we celebrated a solemn feast day. Incense is an important element in Catholic worship. It is used to honor God. However, I have heard back from some of you that the incense was too overpowering and that it affected those of you with asthma and breathing problems. I apologize for the oversight. Surely, if he were a man, everyone in the universe would wake up Christmas morning to find a rotating musical Chia Pet under the tree, still in the bag.


