



From The Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

This coming Monday we will recall with deep sadness the infamous Supreme Court decision *Roe vs. Wade*, which legalized abortion. For 65 years, our country has endured the scourge of abortions. This, of course, does not include the popular use of many contraceptive pills that are abortifacients. (I am sure this will stun many of you.) At the end of World War II, the Allied soldiers were horrified when they discovered the concentration camps where hundreds of thousands of Jews languished like starving animals. But, what sickened the soldiers the most were the gas chambers and crematoriums where millions of Jews would meet their fate. The Germans were forced to tour these places of horror and dig graves for the bodies of the Jews which were piled up.

Abortion is something that occurs privately in thousands of clinic throughout our nation. The gruesome truth about what goes on in these places is deliberately kept hidden from the public eye. Abortion advocates such as Planned Parenthood make every effort to shield people from the ugly fact that unborn humans (actual persons) are killed. However, the recent revelations that abortion mills are in the nefarious business of selling aborted baby parts and organs have begun to startle the American public. But, still not enough. People still remain unconvinced about the moral evil of abortion.

What saddens me so much is the blatant indifference to this tragedy, even among Catholics. So many believe it is a legal and morally necessary choice. Little do they understand that the Church has consistently taught that abortion is a grave evil. St. Ambrose (340-397), bishop of Milan, had this to say: The poor get rid of their small children by exposure and denying them when they are discovered. But the rich also, so that their wealth will not be more divided, deny their children [when they are] in the womb and with all the force of parricide, they kill the beings of their wombs [while they are] in the same fruitful womb. In this way life is taken away from them before it has been given.

This tragedy of abortion has borne another tragedy. Millions and millions of mothers (and fathers) have been deeply wounded by this malaise. We call this post abortion syndrome. There are two beautiful ministries in our church to address this woundedness: They are Project Rachel and Rachel's Vineyard. I highly encourage those members of our congregation who have been so affected by abortion to check out these beautiful apostolates of healing and mercy. These are offered by our diocese. And let's not forget St. Gerard House in St. Augustine. This school offers young girls who find themselves pregnant a chance to save their babies and get a good education. They also offer adoption services. tion. And pray for those who have been so victimized by this evil.


"Well," explained the husband, "it all goes back to our honeymoon. We visited the Grand Canyon and took a trip down to the bottom of the canyon by pack mule."
