

From The Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

Thank you so much for your generous response to my pulpit appeal last weekend. I know that this was a sacrifice for many of you during this time of the year. However, everything, even the smallest amount, helped in a big way to offset our expenses. For those who were not at Corpus Christi Parish last weekend, I mentioned to the parishioners that the parish has found itself in a financial situation. Due to rising expenses such as property insurance, medical insurance and pension payments for the pastor, parish sharing to the diocese, electric bills, technology bills, repairs, etc. and due to the drop in our collections during the summer months, we found out, rather haphazardly, that somehow our operating account had been depleted to \$3,000. I just paid FPL and salaries this week. This left us with approximately \$39,000 in accounts payable.

Last weekend's collection of nearly \$10,000 was a huge bonus for us. Thank you to our parishioners and a number of visitors who gave me sizeable checks. Praise be Jesus Christ! I appreciate your kindness in helping us to become fiscally healthy.

I will re-mention my commitment to this cause as well. I am cutting back on some services in the parish until we become more fiscally sound. Until then, I ask those who did not get this message if you would be willing to increase your level of giving. Please prayerfully consider what you can do to help us meet are ongoing expenses. We are a parish that is growing rapidly in terms of our ministries and use of our parish facilities. In the coming months, more people will be joining us for mass, including our snowbirds. Please help me to keep us strong for the future. God bless you all.

Treasures from Our Traditions

Careful readers of the "Treasures" will have noticed that the two columns about the oldest monastic communities in the United States refer to the colonial states. The Louisiana Purchase gained a great treasure for our nation, the Ursuline monastery of New Orleans. Among the greatest pioneers of that city were nuns who came from France on a perilous voyage in 1727, pestered by pirates and tossed by fearsome storms. These were genteel, well-educated Ursulines, yet their first task was to roll up their sleeves and open a hospital to care for the pestilence-ridden colony. Next, they opened a school for girls and launched a plan to educate the women being shipped over from France to marry settlers. In this way, they had enormous influence in molding patterns of family and domestic life.

At Christmastime in 1814, the threat of a British assault on the city was growing. On the terrifying night of January 7, 1815, the women of New Orleans gathered in the monastery chapel to pray that the city be spared from destruction in battle. The mother superior made a vow to have a Mass of Thanksgiving on that date every year should the Americans win. That night, Our Lady of Prompt Succor, to whom the nuns had great devotion, became the protector and patron of this great city. The convent in the French Quarter is the oldest standing building in the Mississippi valley, and the only surviving building of the French colonial period. The nuns relocated in 1824, but their old monastery is preserved as a museum and archives for the Archdiocese of New Orleans. The school the nuns began, Ursuline Academy, is the oldest continuously operating Catholic school, and school for women, in the United States.
