

From The Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

This coming Tuesday we recall with sadness the anniversary of the Supreme Court decision *Roe vs. Wade (1973)* that legalized abortion in our land. It is one of the worst rulings in our judicial system and ushered in the culture of death that we now live in.

Human life is sacred. From the very moment of conception all the way to the moment of death. This has been the consistent teaching of the Catholic Church. The intentional termination of a pregnancy is considered a grievous offense against God and a violation of the fifth commandment. (Catechism of the Catholic Church 2270 to 2275) Tertullian, an early Church Father (c. 160 to 240), had this to say: In our case, murder being once for all forbidden, we may not destroy even the fetus in the womb, while as yet the human being derives blood from other parts of the body for its sustenance. To hinder a birth is merely a speedier man - killing; nor does it matter whether you take away a life that is born, or destroy one that is coming to the birth. That is a man, which is going to be one; you have the fruit already in the seed. (Apologia 9.6) St. Ambrose (c. 340 to 397) said: Indeed there are those women who cut off the word prematurely born/aborted, before they give birth, there are those who have Christ in the womb but they will not yet have formed (him), to whom it is said: my children, whom I desire to bring forth again and again until Christ be formed in you. Expositio evangelii secundum Lucam, lib. 10, line 25. St. Augustine (c. 354 to 430) stated: Sometimes, indeed, this lustful cruelty, or if you please, cruel lust, resorts to such extravagant methods as to use poisonous drugs to secure barrenness; or else, if unsuccessful in this, to destroy the conceived seed by some means previous to birth, preferring that its offspring should rather perish than receive vitality; or if it was advancing to life within the womb, should be slain before it was born. De Nube et Concupiscentia 1.17 (15)

The popes, especially those within the last century, have also unswervingly spoken against abortion. St. John Paul II was very vocal and clear about where the Church stood on the issue of abortion. On March 25, 1995, the Feast of the Annunciation, the pope issued the encyclical The Gospel of Life. This was one of the clearest and loudest proclamations that all human life is sacred. Abortion is intrinsically evil.

However, the pope also knew that unborn babies were not only the victims in abortions. Their mothers were also. "I would like to say a special word to women who have had an abortion. The Church is aware of the many factors which may have influenced your decision, and she does not doubt that in many cases it was a painful and even shattering decision. The wound in your heart may not yet have healed. Certainly what happened was and remains terribly wrong. But do not give in to discouragement and do not lose hope. Try

rather to understand what happened and face it honestly."

"If you have not already done so, give yourselves over with humility and trust to repentance. The Father of mercies is ready to give you his forgiveness and his peace in the Sacrament of Reconciliation. You will come to understand that nothing is definitely lost and you will also be able to ask forgiveness from your child, who is now living in the Lord."

"With the friendly and expert help and advice of other people, and as a result of your own painful experience, you can be among the most eloquent defenders of everyone's right to life. Through your commitment to life, whether by accepting the birth of other children or by welcoming and caring for those most in need of someone to be close to them, you will become promoters of a new way of looking at human life."

St. John Paul II knew that legalized abortion was devastating the lives of women who chose to terminate their pregnancies. There is a great need to minister to those who suffer emotional and psychic pain over a choice they made years ago or even recently. The Church loves these women (and the fathers of these children) and has answer. There are two ministries in our diocese that address the wounds of mothers and fathers of abortion: Project Rachel and Rachel's Vineyard. For Project Rachel, a private counseling ministry, call Ann Crowder at the Catholic Center at (904) 262-3200. For Rachel's Vineyard, a Eucharistic weekend retreat, call (904) 221-3232.

As your pastor and shepherd of souls, I cannot remain mute on this silent tragedy of abortion. It would be a contradiction of my very priesthood. Yet, at the same time, I am dedicated to helping women and men heal from the devastating grief that comes when people choose to terminate their babies. I ask our parish community to always pray that this great tragedy comes to an end and also pray for those affected by abortion. Remember that God is very merciful. The sin of abortion is a forgivable sin. Come to the tribunal of God's merciful love in the confessional. Embrace Christ's compassion for you.

Unborn children have every right to be born into this world, whether wanted or unwanted. We have no right to choose evil over good. The country we live in may say we have a right to choose to abort or to give birth. But, whose laws are greater??? Our civil laws or God's laws??? Choose Life!

Treasures From Our Traditions

The cause of church unity is commended to Christians for prayer and action every year around this time. This week is not so much to focus on the many divisions within the Christian family, but on bonds of faith and mission. Even though Christians have always shown an inclination to fracture, spin off, and mutate into new expressions, recent history shows some new points of convergence and agreement. Catholics are more firmly rooted in the word of God, for example, and many Protestants are more likely to celebrate Communion than in years past. Some denominations are merging and pooling resources, and people from various traditions are collaborating on projects. The call of this week is to be mindful of the diversity of our traditions and customs while treasuring what we hold in common. The old advice to lighten up is good medicine, because sometimes our differences are delightful and amusing. If someone says, Let us pray, a Catholic might close the eyes, bow the head and fold hands; a Protestant reach out and clasp hands with the person in the next chair; and someone belonging to an Orthodox tradition might stand up with eyes wide open. Each has taken a different path, but the goal is always the same. This is a week not for focusing on the well-worn paths of divergence, but for mutual delight in a common goal.
