From The Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

Next weekend, the Eucharistic Congress in Jacksonville will take place. While I realize that this is quite a drive for many of our parishioners, I will honestly say it is worth the drive. I have participated in the congress every year. From the parish, it takes roughly 50 minutes to reach the Prime Osborn Center off of I-95. This year the Diocese of St. Augustine has a great line-up of dynamic speakers, including Fr. Wade Menezes, a mission priest of the Fathers of Mercy, the same order that our mission speaker Fr. Jewel is from. There is a youth tract and activities for children. Also, on Friday evening, the members of the *Communitas Cenacolo* in St. Augustine will be performing live Stations of the Cross. This is a very powerful and moving play. If you have never seen it, make plans to see it on Friday.

Last weekend, I told you about the Bishop's Lenten message which was placed near all the bulletins. Some of you may not be aware that the Bishop's Annual Stewardship Appeal took a big hit from large contributors due to the issue of the priest and bishop scandals that have rocked the Catholic Church. A number of contributors are irate over the bishops handling of clergy abusers. Consequently, they have decided to hold back their yearly contributions to the diocese. This has impacted the BASA in a big way.

Let me say this in defense of Bishop Estevez. He is a very good and holy bishop. He is unfairly being penalized for things that were not on his watch. I know for a fact that he does not, in any way, shape or fashion, tolerate cases of clergy abuse. If a case arises, he deals with it promptly. It is unfortunate that in this climate of anger and lack in trust in the shepherds of the Church many good bishops are being maligned for not being more prompt in addressing these crimes. I know Bishop Estevez is very, very quick to take action. He has a rock solid legal team to deal with all cases. So, please, I ask you to support our bishop with your prayers and in the BASA.

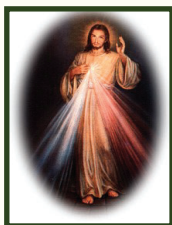

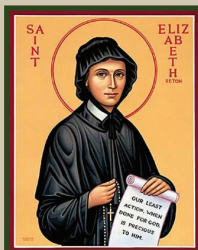

Treasures From Our Faith

Hollywood has given us an image of Moses slipping off his shoes before a burning bush. God has just called Moses by name, and so that Moses doesn't miss the meaning of this breakthrough in human history, God requires that all barriers to the experience be eliminated. If you've ever tried to maneuver barefoot across hot sand, or pick your way along a rocky beach, you know how sensitive feet can be.

Within the Church, there are religious orders with a custom of going barefoot, not merely to show poverty, but to be an outward sign of a desire for connection with creation, a desire to go through life alert to what God is doing. In early days, when reconciliation was a once-in-a-lifetime possibility, penitents often went barefoot for a long period of time as a sign of their conversion. Even today, people follow an ancient practice of slipping off their shoes to walk in the procession to the cross on Good Friday. It is striking that the first use of our newly-scrubbed feet from Holy Thursday night is to walk resolutely in the footsteps of Christ to the cross.

God says to Moses, This is what you shall tell the Israelites: I AM sent me to you . . . The LORD, the God of your ancestors, the God of Abraham, the God of Isaac, the God of Jacob.
