From The Pastor's Desk

Dear Parishioners,

Summer is just a few weeks away. College graduations are going on and soon high school graduations. This week-end our children will receive their First Holy Communion. Next our teenagers will receive Confirmation. Religious Education is coming to an end. May is a busy month indeed. The school year is coming to a close, and vacation plans are being made.

Having said that, there are three things I want to say: First, I would like to thank all of our volunteer religious education teachers for their hard work and dedication throughout the school calendar year, including most especially Sue Ann Nanney, our DRE. Your time and talent are deeply appreciated.

Second, congratulations to our college graduates. I wish you munificent blessings as you take on the world with all of the knowledge you acquired. Do not forget the most important knowledge you acquired over the years, especially in your youth – your Catholic faith. Stay close to the Church as you begin your new career.

Third, to our soon-be-high-school-graduates, you will be going off to college soon or perhaps directly into the workforce. Whatever you decide, do not put your Catholic faith to the side, especially since you will no longer be under the wings of your parents. Your Catholic faith is vitally important. Do not confuse high school graduation as a freedom to do whatever you want and abandon the values your parents taught you. Put Christ Jesus before all things. There lies true wisdom!

"Actually," the man replied, "I was wondering who did this to my luggage."

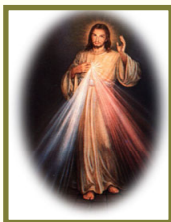

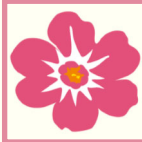
