

Today's Readings

Wisdom 6:12-16; Psalm 63:2, 3-4, 5-6, 7-8; 1 Thessalonians 4:13-18 or 4:13-

Lectura, as de Hoy

Sabiduria 6:12-16; Salmo 62:2, 3-4, 5-6, 7-8; 1 Tesaionicenses 4:13-14, o 4:13-18; Mateo 25:1-13

The parables in general make little or no sense if treated literally. In today's parable, we may ask ourselves: Why did the foolish virgins not take enough oil, knowing that wedding feasts were to last for a couple of days? Why did they not join the wedding with the little oil they still had? Why must they go out at midnight to buy oil, considering that shops would not be opened at this time? The wise virgins were certainly their friends; why were they not generous to them? Parables, we should remember only have meaning when understood from the perspective of the intention that they are recounted. The main message from this parable is: "Stay awake, for you do not know the day nor the hour". Let us examine some symbols used in this parable so as to understand it better. The virgins were ten in number. Ten is considered as a complete and perfect number, signifying testimony, law, responsibility and the completeness of order. Accordingly, the virgins represent the church waiting for the coming of the messiah. Are we conscious like the wise virgins or careless as the foolish virgins?

Las parábolas generales tienen poco o ningún sentido si se las trata literalmente. En la parábola de hoy, podemos preguntarnos: ¿Por qué las vírgenes insensatas no tomaron suficiente aceite, sabiendo que las bodas tendrían una duración de un par de días? ¿Por qué no se unieron a la boda con el poco aceite que todavía tenían? ¿Por qué deben salir a la medianoche para comprar petróleo, teniendo en cuenta que las tiendas no se abrirán en este momento? Las vírgenes prudentes eran ciertamente sus amigas; ¿Por qué no fueron generosas con ellos? ¿Por qué el maestro era tan escrupuloso o inseguro cuando volvían a esa hora de la noche? Las parábolas, debemos recordar solo tienen significado cuando se entienden desde la perspectiva de la intención de que se relaten. El mensaje principal de esta parábola es: "Manténgase despierto, ya que no conoce el día ni la hora". Las historias de parábolas no son todas lógicas. Examinemos algunos símbolos usados en esta parábola para entenderlo mejor. Las vírgenes eran diez en número. A Jesús le encantaba usar el número 10 en muchas de sus palabras, particularmente en su parábola: había 10 leprosos (Lucas 17: 11-19), había 10 talentos (Mateo 25: 14-30), había 10 minas (Lucas 19). : 12-27), hubo exactamente 10 "YO SOY" hablados por Jesús en el Evangelio de Juan. Diez es considerado como un número completo y perfecto, que significa testimonio, ley, responsabilidad y la integridad del orden. En consecuencia, las vírgenes representan principalmente al pueblo de Israel esperando la venida del Mesías. ¿Dónde pertenezco; la virgen sabia o la tonta?

What is Black Catholic History Month?

On July 24, 1990, the National Black Catholic Clergy Caucus of the United States designated November as Black Catholic History Month to celebrate the history and heritage of black Catholics. November is significant because two important black saints are commemorated within the month: St. Martin de Porres' feast day (Nov. 3) and St. Augustine's birthday (Nov. 13). With All Saints and All Souls' Day, we also remember the saints and souls of Africa and the African Diaspora.

African-American Catholics by the numbers

There are 3 million African-American Catholics in the United States.

Of Roman Catholic parishes in the United States, 798 are considered to be predominantly African-American. Most of those continue to be on the East Coast and in the South.

About 76 percent of African-American Catholics are in diverse or shared parishes, and 24 percent are in predominately African-American parishes.

As of February 2017, there are 15 living African-American bishops, eight of whom remain active, and six U.S. dioceses are headed by African-American bishops.

What is the diocese's African-American Affairs Ministry?

On May 17, 1985, a group of 10 people calling themselves the Committee for Concerned Black Catholics met to discuss issues and concerns that were particular to black Catholics in the diocese. They urged then Bishop John Donoghue to coordinate efforts of black Catholics in the diocese.

In July 1985, the ministry was officially begun as the Diocesan Committee on Black Catholic Ministry and Evangelization, and was a part of the diocesan Ministry for Justice and Peace. In 1989 it became a separate office to address and serve the needs and concerns of black Catholics in the diocese.

Since then, the African-American Affairs Ministry has grown. Its main goal is make visible the work, contributions, traditions and culture of black Catholics to the Church and to society, and to propose adequate diocesan responses to racism and other social injustices.
