As a requirement for an Idaho real estate license, you will need to be fingerprinted. Although you don't need to have them prior to taking the class, this step is required to apply for your real estate license once you finish class, and since sometimes takes up to 3-5 weeks to receive them back, you may choose to plan ahead. You'll need to call for an appointment (phone number & instructions attached); the facility is called Pearson Vue. It's a little tricky to find, but in Boise, it's located in the Black Eagle Center on the corner of Overland & Maple Grove – the address is: 9183 West Blackeagle Drive, Boise, ID 83709, (208) 375-3079. Directions: From I-84 take exit 50A, west on Overland Road for app. one mile. Turn right (north) on S. Kimball Place, turn right (east) on Falcon Court. Pearson Vue is located on the north side of the street behind Banner Bank into the Saint Alphonsus Hospice building, and the entrance door is located on the east side of the building.
