

There are 3 textbooks – a national book called “Mastering Real Estate Principles”, an Idaho handbook and a small red Idaho law book. Although you won’t need to read anything as a pre-requisite to the class, I recommend checking out the chapters in the national and Idaho books and taking the quizzes at the end of each (answer sheets are in the back) to test your comprehension. The law book is where a good portion of the Idaho exam comes from – a little dry reading because it’s statute, but it might help to start with the Idaho Guidelines beginning on pg. 61. These are the “user-friendly” interpretations of the statutes. We’ll also be discussing some other tips and tricks to study that book in class.
