

What is the School District's Role in Supporting My Student's Success?

Local educational agencies (LEAs) are defined as school districts, that are responsible for the following actions:

- ◆ Plan and implement educational programs, activities, and procedures that involve parents/families, as required by Title I.
- ◆ Reserve 1% of Title I funds for parent/family engagement activities.
- ◆ Develop a parent/family engagement policy with the participation of parents/families.
- ◆ Provide opportunities for participation of parents/families with limited English proficiency, parents/families of migratory children and, when appropriate, in a language and format that they can understand.
- ◆ Conduct annual parent surveys and implement changes based upon the results of those surveys.
- ◆ Build capacity by providing early literacy and technology trainings that will help parents/families work with their children to improve academic achievement .

The Long County School System takes pride in offering its students many opportunities for educational growth; from pre-kindergarten through high school, with programs to meet a diverse student population.

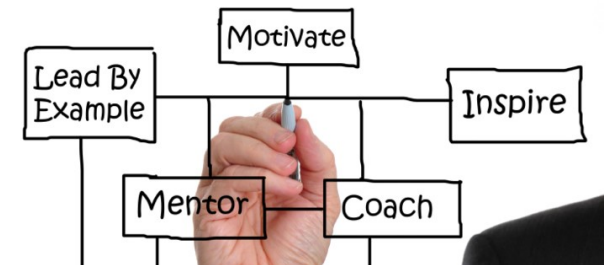
Long County offers numerous special programs including:
