What is the School District's Role in Supporting My Student's Success?

Local educational agencies (LEAs) are defined as school districts, that are responsible for the following actions:

- Plan and implement educational programs, activities, and procedures as required under Title I that involves parents/families.
- Reserve 1% of Title I funds for parent/family engagements.
- Develop a parent/family engagement policy with the participation of parents/families.
- Provide full opportunities for participation of parents/families with limited English proficiency, disabilities and parent/families of migratory children, and when appropriate, in a language and format that they can understand.
- Conduct annual parent surveys and implement changes based upon the results of those surveys.
- Build capacity by providing early literacy and technology trainings that will help parents work with their children to improve academic achievement.
