What We Do

Clubs perform a wide variety of local fundraising and service projects. Each club assesses their community's greatest need to determine what projects to undertake and how to distribute funds raised within the local community.

National Partners

Kin Canada has been a partner in the fight against cystic fibrosis since 1964. During this time, Kin members have raised over \$41 million in support of the work of Cystic Fibrosis Canada. We are also a Partner for Life with Canadian Blood Services.

National Headquarters

Located in Cambridge, Ontario, nine staff provide administrative services to the Kinsmen, Kinette and Kin clubs across the country.

- members of the Clubs may enjoy personal development through the Association;
- they may be improved and educated in modern business and professional methods and ethics;
- the involvement of all in the enrichment of their community may be stimulated;
- a spirit of co-operation, tolerance, understanding and equality among all nations and peoples be fostered and that unity of thought and purpose throughout Canada be established toward this goal; and
- they shall serve their community's greatest need.

WHAT IS CYSTIC FIBROSIS?

Cystic fibrosis (CF) is the most common fatal genetic disease affecting Canadian children and young adults. There is no cure.

Cystic fibrosis causes a build-up of thick mucus in the lungs leading to severe respiratory problems. Similarly, mucus and protein build-up in the digestive track results in extreme difficulty in the digesting and absorbing adequate nutrients from food.

The effects of cystic fibrosis are most devastating in the lungs. Ultimately, most CF deaths are due to lung disease. More than 4,000 Canadian children adolescents and adults with cystic fibrosis receive specialized care at one of the 42 CF clinics across the country.

In 2016, the **Kinsmen Club of Barrie** joined the **Trillium Gift of Life Network** (TGLN) in its mission to save and enhance lives through the gift of organ and tissue donation and transplantation in Ontario by committing to spreading the word about organ donation through an organizational **BeADonor** campaign. <https://www.beadonor.ca>

Currently, almost 1,600 people in Ontario are waiting for a life-saving organ transplant. And though most of us believe that organ donation is a good thing, just over a quarter of us are registered as donors. The city of Barrie is currently ranked 56 out of 170 communities in Ontario, with a 43% donor registration rate. The good news is that our community is 13% above Ontario's average – the reality is, we can do better!
