Since our founding in 1920, Kin Canada clubs have donated more than \$1 billion to Canadian causes, communities and individuals in need, as well as to disaster relief efforts beyond our borders.

What We Do

Clubs perform a wide variety of local fundraising and service projects. Each club assesses their community's greatest need to determine what projects to undertake and how to distribute funds raised within the local community.

National Partners

Kin Canada has been a partner in the fight against cystic fibrosis since 1964. During this time, Kin members have raised over \$41 million in support of the work of Cystic Fibrosis Canada. We are also a Partner for Life with Canadian Blood Services.

Our Impact

Day of KINdness

National Day of KINdness is for our members and clubs to celebrate our founding and commitment to serve the community's greatest need. Every community has a need for kindness and people performing selfless acts, and our clubs are able to spearhead this in their communities.

Disaster Relief

The disaster relief fund provides financial assistance to communities in both Canada and beyond our borders during times of crises. Clubs from coast-to-coast are always quick to act when disaster strikes, through donations, fundraisers and physically lending a hand to help.

Canadian Blood Services

Since 2014, Kin Canada has been a National Partner for Life with Canadian Blood Services. In that time, clubs have helped advocate for blood donorship through awareness initiatives and blood donation, collectively donating over 1,000 units.

Kin Canada Bursaries

Kin Canada Bursaries is one of the largest non-corporate provider of bursaries in Canada. **Over \$900,000** in bursaries has been awarded since 1994 to assist deserving students in their pursuit of a post-secondary education. In 2020, Kin Canada will strive to grant 100 bursaries to celebrate 100 years of Kin!

Milk for Britain

With over 50 million quarts of milk sent and \$3 million raised to feed British children, the Milk for Britain campaign is a significant and inspirational piece of Canada's (and Kin's) history.


WHAT IS CYSTIC FIBROSIS?

Cystic fibrosis (CF) is the most common fatal genetic disease affecting Canadian children and young adults. There is no cure.

Cystic fibrosis causes a build-up of thick mucus in the lungs leading to severe respiratory problems. Similarly, mucus and protein build-up in the digestive track results in extreme difficulty in the digesting and absorbing adequate nutrients from food.

The effects of cystic fibrosis are most devastating in the lungs. Ultimately, most CF deaths are due to lung disease. More than 4,000 Canadian children, adolescents, and adults with cystic fibrosis receive specialized care at one of the 42 CF clinics across the country.

Together with Kin Canada, we will make cystic fibrosis history.



Then and Now

In 1960, most children with cystic fibrosis did not live long enough to attend kindergarten. Today, because of the support of Kin members and other generous donors, Canadians with cystic fibrosis have one of the highest survival rates in the world.



Kin Canada and CF

Kin Canada is the nation's largest all-Canadian service organization. Founded in 1920, its members are active community volunteers. Kinsmen, Kinette and Kin clubs across Canada support Cystic Fibrosis Canada and fund other local projects. The clubs offer their members opportunities to change lives by making a difference in the lives of others.

in 2014, Kin Canada celebrated 50 years in the fight against cystic fibrosis. Since 1944, Kinsmen and Kinettes have raised more than \$43 million in support of the work of Cystic Fibrosis Canada. These dedicated volunteers raise funds through a variety of activities including golf tournaments, lotteries, galas, telethons, bake sales, and road-toll events.

Kin members are dedicated to making cystic fibrosis history by participating in various Cystic Fibrosis Canada national fundraisers.




32%
of Ontarians are registered donors.
That's 3.9 million out of an eligible 12.3 million.

Currently, almost 1,600 people in Ontario are waiting for a life-saving organ transplant. And though most of us believe that organ donation is a good thing, just under 1/3 of us are registered as donors. The City of Barrie is currently ranked 65 out of 170 communities in Ontario, with a 44% donor registration rate - 12% above Ontario's average!


The structure of Kin Canada


