COMMUNION STEWARD

Volunteers are needed to set up communion. Please consider helping. You can set alone or ask a friend to partner with you. Communion is usually served on the first Sunday of each month. Additional services such as Easter or Christmas Eve may be added based on Pastor Erich or the Worship Committee's plans. The more helpers who volunteer, the fewer months will be assigned to each communion steward.

In order to set up for a monthly service, the communion steward can either buy packaged bread, make homemade bread, or buy frozen yeast loaves that have directions for thawing, rising, and baking so they are "homemade" but very easy to prepare. The steward will also provide the grape juice. All of the equipment and supplies are provided by the church so the setup is convenient and quick. If desired, the juice cups can be filled on the Friday or Saturday before communion, placed in the church refrigerator, then placed on the altar the morning of communion. On Communion Sunday the steward sets up for the early service then between services "cleans" up and replaces the used loaf of bread with a fresh loaf for the 11 am service. After the late service, the altar and rail are cleared, communion supplies cleaned and returned to storage until needed the following month.

A former or current communion steward will help you as you learn this new job. It is rewarding but not difficult. The church needs additional communion stewards at this time so please consider volunteering. Call the church office, email Carla, or put your name on the white slip of paper in the pew. Thank you for your service!
