FNSSP Incentive Program

The First Nation Student Success Program supports activities that increase students' achievement levels in reading and writing (literacy), mathematics (numeracy) and encourage students to remain in school (student retention).

Activities funded through this program are school success plans that set out goals, activities and targets for improving student achievement levels in the three priority levels (literacy, numeracy and student retention).

A huge part of this program is the incentive awards, which gives our students the opportunity to earn gift cards from Wal-mart, Subway, Cineplex, Itunes, google play etc. These gift cards are awarded at the end of each month from September to June.

How it works:

Literacy-a student is eligible to earn a \$10.00 gift card for every 100 pages read in a novel/book. Example: a student has read a 300 page book at the end of the month they will earn a \$30.00 gift card.

There are two ways to earn the literacy incentives;

- 1) The literature material maybe a novel or book that has been assigned from any English class.
- 2) Participating in the home reading program. Students are welcome to sign out books from our school library or read a book from home. Once the student has completed the book they must submit a one page book report.

Numeracy-Mathletics is a online math learning space providing students with all the tools they need to be successful learners, both in the classroom and beyond. The program awards students with silver & gold certificates and SOS uses those certificates to reward the students with a \$10.00 gift card for Silver or \$25 for Gold.

Student Responsibilities and Expectations

- ◆ Daily attendance is required. If students are missing more than 3 days in a row, a phone call followed by a home visit will be arranged.
- ◆ School working hours are a minimum of 9 am – 3 pm. Students must sign in daily.
- ◆ Buses only stop at your house if the student is on the bus regularly. If a student has missed the bus more than three consecutive times please phone education office to start bus service again. Any students getting on the bus with babies must have a car seat.
- ◆ A minimum of 3 modules per week is a requirement of SOS Students. Please be prepared to attend school ready to work hard.
- ◆ If your child is experiencing difficulty with school work or non- related school issues that keep them from their school work please set up a meeting with Bruce to create workable solutions.
- ◆ We have access to social workers, psychologist and elders to help support our students. Please contact me if you feel you or your child would benefit from any of our supports.
